# Bear Lake Stake Timeline

# 1863

**Soda Springs**: soldiers build a temporary fort on the Bear River and invite the Morrisites to build up the area. They settle in what is now Morristown, but the settlement never takes off. [MH]

August 23: In Logan, Brigham Young meets in council with general and local leaders.<sup>1</sup> "It was decided that Preston Thomas and others be at liberty to make a settlement on the other side of Cub River." *This is the public story* 

August 23: In the actual account of this meeting: Present are "Presidents Brigham Young, Heber C. Kimball, Daniel H. Wells, of the Twelve Apostles, John Taylor, George A. Smith, Ezra T. Benson, Charles C. Rich and Franklin D. Richards. President Joseph Young and Elders Peter Maughan, Amos ?, Orson Arnold, John Y Long. Bishop John Rowberry [Tooele]", they consider and decide to settle Bear Lake Valley. "President Young stated the object of the meeting to be the consideration of taking immediate (?) [prospecting?] of Bear Lake Valley by sending a company of men there this fall. He further remarked that in a conversation with brother Benson he had understood that bro. Rich would like to take charge of such a company and he would like to know Elder Rich's mind upon the subject. C.C. Rich then remarked that he did not feel like volunteering, but was willing to do whatever the President said. President Young then spoke as follows: The Twelve have been rised up, they are tried out with hard labor, and now the time has come that they can do more good at home then they can by going abroad to preach the gospel. The again, the Twelve should sustain themselves as far as possible, or with as little help as they can get along with. I am pretty well satisfied that I put more to the big pile than I have taken away, but this is for example. It is our privilege to live and be sustained by the tithing, for the tithing is to sustain the priesthood, to build Temples and feed the poor, this is not a good policy so far as we are concerned; I think it is much better for us to sustain ourselves. Now what I am about to say you will do well to keep to yourselves. We have it in our minds to settle Bear River Lake Valley; I for one, would like to have a settlement there. As yet I have said nothing to anyone except to brother Benson. Now if you will keep this matter to yourselves nobody will know anything about it, but otherwise it will be telegraphed to old Abe Lincoln by some of? officers, and then it will be made a preservation of immediately to prevent us getting it. Now you may excuse me or not, but he is a damned old scamp and villain, and I don't believe that Pharaoh of old was any worse, or any wickeder....President Young to C. C. Rich: Brother Benson thought you would like to go there. I never had a feeling about it, but brother Benson and me had a talk on the subject and he thought you would be pleased to go. Elder Charles C. Rich: So far as pulling up stakes and moving my entire family, I would rather not

- do it. President Brigham Young: I will tell what I would do; I would rather have my family all together...President Joseph Young wished to know if the valley under contemplation was in this Territory. The President: All I have to say is that I don't know, neither do I care... "
- <u>September 14th</u>: Calls are begun to be issued for people to go and settle the valley. Thomas Sleight records his call in his diary. [Sleight, Thomas. Thomas Sleight diaries. Microfilm MS 9406.]
- September 26th: Paris: First settlers arrive at Paris and in the Bear Lake Valley. Robert H Williams "appointed to preside under President Charles C. Rich" as President Rich "returned in December to Salt Lake for the winter..." along with Alonzo Bingham. .1 Robert Williams, a former bishop in Cache Valley, Providence Ward, appoints men to visit families and has church service every Sunday. About 48 men, 40 women and 30-40 children arrive that year. [EH, Paris MH, Paris Stake MH]/Sleight]

- More settlers arrive in the valley during the year. Settlements of Bloomington, Ovid, St. Charles, Montpelier, Fish Haven, Liberty, and Bennington founded. Elder Charles C. Rich brings his family to the valley. President Young visits the valley.
- **Meadowville**: settlers, led by Joseph W. Moore (PE?), arrive in Round Valley near Chimney Town, which is close to Meadowville. The settlement is soon abandoned and some go to Mud Town (Meadowville) and Sly Go. [MH]
- Spring: **Bennington**: First settlers arrive in Bennington area. Initially no meetings occur. [EH 58][MH]
- Spring: **Fish Haven**: First settlers arrive. Preston Thomas called as the Presiding Elder and meetings held in private homes for the first winter. [EH251-252, MH]
- Spring: **Paris**: Paris organized as a branch. Alonzo Bingham begins to act as Presiding Elder of the settlement. [MH]
- April: **New Haven [St. Charles]**: First settled in 1864 by Robert Poe and Geo. M. Pugmere. [EH724-725, MH]
- April: **Liberty**: First settlers arrive. Levi Hammond called as first Presiding Elder by Elder Rich. [EH443][MH][Sleight]
- April: **Montpelier**: first settled, "no one had been delegated to preside or assume charge of affairs, so the Saints met in Council and without a dissenting vote decided on John Cozzens to preside over them. The matter was later submitted to Apostle Rich who approved the choice of John Cozzens and ordained him a Priest and set him apart to preside…" 1 Settlement was known first as Clover Creek and then Bellevue.[EH528-529][MH][History of the Bear Lake Pioneers 2nd Edition. - April 23rd: President Rich returns back to the Bear Lake Valley after crossing the mountains on snowshoes to attend the SLC general conference. [MH, Sleight][Rich, Russell R. Land of the Sky-Blue Water: A History of the LDS Settlement of the Bear Lake Valley ( Provo; Brigham Young University Press, 1963). Accessed on 3/10/2018.

April 24th: **Bloomington**: first settlers arrive in Bloomington area. David B. Dillie is called as the First Presiding Officer of the branch by Apostle Charles C. Rich. He acted without counselors. James H Hart called later in the year as Presiding Elder to replace David B Dille.[EH, MH]

April 28: first settlers on North Creek (Ovid).<sup>3</sup> Robert H. Williams presides at first [EH625-626][MH][Sleight]1 [History of the Bear Lake Pioneers 2nd Edition. Daughters of Utah Pioneers Bear Lake County, Idaho (Salt Lake City: Utah Printing Company, 1974), 320]

May 20th-22nd: President Brigham Young and other leaders visit Bear Lake Valley, looking at settlement sites. President Young suggests New Haven be renamed St. Charles, and for it to be the county seat rather than Paris. "Elder Charles C. Rich, one of the Twelve Apostles, has been appointed to dictate the settlement of this valley...the business of the valley will be done at St. Charles whether Brother Rich lives here or there, or whether the High Council is held here or there..." "As to whether we are in Utah Territory or Idaho Territory, I think we are now in Idaho, I have no doubt of it, and the greater part of those who settle in this valley will be in that territory; the snow lays too low on the mountains there for Utah." They visit the new settlements in Paris, Three Mile Creek [Bloomington], St. Charles, Fish Haven.<sup>5</sup>

Summer: St. Charles: Wm. G. Young was called by President Charles C. Rich as first Presiding Elder. [MH]

July: Religious meetings start in Liberty. [MH]

September 14th: Bloomington: President Young visits Bloomington. [MH] There is no record of Brigham Young coming to Bear Lake Valley at this time; he does visit on this date in 1867.

#### 1865

Brigham Young visits the valley. [We cannot find any record of Brigham Young coming to Bear Lake Valley in 1865.]

Name of Bellevue changed to **Montpelier** at the suggestion of President Brigham Young. [MH] **Ovid**: Henry Gasman called as Presiding Elder<sup>6</sup> [EH625-626, MH]

Jan 16: Charles C. Rich writes Brigham Young on the state of the settlement mission.<sup>7</sup> Mentions "the principle settlements:" St. Charles, Bloomington (schoolhouse almost

complete), Paris, Ovid, Mont Peler (has a new schoolhouse), about 1100 inhabitants total.

Fall: **Preston (Wardboro)**: Nathaniel and Moroni Green are the first settlers to arrive in area. [EH921][MH]

September 10th: "Bishop W.G. Young [St. Charles] called a council meeting composed of W.G. Young, E.M. Greene, John Crozzens, Robt. Pope, J.C. Rich, R.R. Hopkins, A. Bingham, J.H. Hunt..." where the leaders discuss the need for grain and write a petition asking for Salt Lake to send grain to help them. They also discuss their determination to stay in the valley. #### 1866

**Bennington**: Evan M. Greene appointed Presiding Elder, but was replaced later that year by Dudley J. Merrill. (Some uncertainty when Evan M. Greene was appointed as Presiding Elder, it could be between 1864-1866) [MH]

**Fish Haven**: Preston Thomas moves to Preston (Wardboro) and Joseph W. Moore called as the Presiding Elder [EH251-252, MH]

Ovid: Niels Chr. Edlefsen succeeded Henry Gasman as Presiding Elder<sup>8</sup> [MH]

April 5: General bishops meeting resumes after a few years hiatus. Ward reps include "bishop" of "Richland."

May: **Bloomington**: "President Edward Haddock resigned his office as President of the Elders Quorum. Moved by Bishop J.H. Hart that Bro. E Haddock's resignation be accepted..." Isaac Dunford is called and accepted as new President. [Paris Idaho Stake Melchizedek Priesthood minutes and records. Microfilm LR583 13.]

<u>Summer:</u> First Sunday School organized in Paris, Idaho. Evan A. Williams called as superintendent, with Thos. Sleight and Keziah Davis as counselors. [MH]

Nov 19: Brigham Young writes to "President Charles C. Rich" 10

<u>December 7th</u>: **Liberty:** Edwin N. Austin called to be the bishop of the Liberty Ward by Charles C. Rich. [EH443, MH][History of the Bear Lake Pioneers 2nd Edition. Daughters of Utah Pioneers Bear Lake County, Idaho (Salt Lake City: Utah Printing Company, 1974), 39-41]

<u>December 16th</u>: **St. Charles**: "Meeting called by President W.G. Young...being bishop" in which the teacher's quorum was organized and John A. Hunt was called as its president. [Saint Charles Ward general minutes. Microfilm LR 7742]

Saint Charles: First Sunday School organized. [MH]

Spring: Laketown: first settlers arrive. First church meetings are officially held. John Oldfield is chosen by people to run meetings. [EH412-413][MH]

April 7th: "We have been favored with the minutes of a Conference held, on the 7th of April, in Montpelier Richland CO, a notice of which should have appeared earlier, but our home mails are not at all seasons of the year prompt to schedule time, any more than the mails from the east. Pres. CC Rich having been at the General Conference, Elder James H. Hart presided over the meetings, at which interesting and instructive discourses were delivered and remarks made, by Elder Hart, Bishop WG Young, Elders William Allred, Alonzo Bingham, John Cozzens, John Stock, Edwin A. August 12th: St. Charles: In Teachers Quorum meeting, President CC Rich comes to settle a dispute between President W.G. Young and Bro. Pugmire. He chastises both for the contention, especially since both previously had been bishops. W.G Young resigns as President. President CC Rich calls John Alexander Hunt 1 as branch president. [EH724-725] [MH] [Saint Charles Ward general minutes. Microfilm LR 7742][Saint Charles Ward financial accounts. Manuscript LR 7742 21.1

September 11-14: President Brigham Young visits the Bear Lake Valley and holds meetings in Paris, Bloomington, and St. Charles. 11

## 1868

**Evanston**: Built by Union Pacific workers [EH238-239] Ovid: Ovid Ward Relief society organized. [MH]

February 17th: Charles C. Bridges records, ".. I was appointed president of the Teachers Quorum by John Cozzens..." [Bridges, Charles H. Charles H. Bridges journal. Microfilm MS 14570]

April 25: In first of a series of published Church directories, the following are listed: 12

- Charles C. Rich, "County President" of Rich County
- No wards or bishops listed

Spring: Laketown: Sly Go (Round Valley) is abandoned and settlers move to Laketown [MH]. Spring: meetings start in Preston [Wardsboro], presided over by Preston Thomas (appointed by Charles C. Rich) [MH]

May 26th: Paris: Elder Charles C. Rich organizes the first Relief Society in Paris with Keziah Davis as President, with Eliza Ann Rich and Maria Rich as counselors. [MH]

July: *Bloomington*: Relief Society organized.[MH][Bloomington Ward Relief Society minutes and records. Microfilm LR 789 14]

<u>August 31st</u>: **St. Charles**: President Charles C. Rich organizes the Relief Society.[MH] [Saint Charles Ward Relief Society minutes and records. Microfilm LR 7742 14]

September 20th: *Montpelier*: Sunday School organized [MH]

# 1869

**Laketown**: Ira Nebeker called as Presiding Elder and sent by Elder Charles C. Rich to preside over settlement.[EH, MH]

**Garden City**: Cub Johnson settles along Swan Creek and more settlers arrive in the present spot of Garden City. [MH]

Soda Springs: first permanent settler (non-LDS) arrives in Soda Springs.

June 16: On their way to Paris, BY and company pass through Round Valley [south end of Bear Lake] and "the settlement called Last Chance." \*\*Is Laketown? Meadowville?

June 19-20: In Paris, Bear Lake Valley Stake (and school of the prophets) organized by President Brigham Young and other general authorities. <sup>14</sup> David Patten Kimball sustained as President of the Stake. "a High Council was organized for "Rich County". Brigham Young and Daniel H. Wells were in attendance as well as John Taylor, Wilford Woodruff, Ezra T. Benson, C.C. Rich, George Q. Cannon, and Brigham Young Jr of the Twelve. Pres Young nominated David P. Kimball as president of "this stake of Zion". High councilors were "selected and ordained, by the first presidency and the quorum of the twelve and set apart." The men were: G.W. Sirrine, James H. Hart, John A. Hunt, Nels C Edlefsen, Harley Mowrey, Thomas Sleight, Joseph C. Rich, Lewis Ricks, W.W. Sterrett, E. N. Austin, Miner Wilcox, Alonzo Bingham. Alonzo Bingham was not present at the meeting and was not ordained that day. George W. Sirrine, "being the oldest member was appointed president of the twelve councillors." The benediction was offered by George Q. Cannon." This was also the first meeting of the Rich County School of the Prophets and was the beginning of the High Council meetings, which would continue actively up till the Reorganization of 1877.

June 19: BY announces plans to organize a School of the Prophets and stake at a priesthood meeting in Paris and they the elders vote approval. High council sustained and ordained. June 19: At first meeting of Paris School of the Prophets, High Council sustained and ordained. Ordained an high priest and was set apart as the President of this Stake of Zion under the

June 20: C.C. Rich chosen as president of SotP, David P. Kimball as VP and President of the stake; he is asked to choose his own counselors "at his leisure". <sup>17</sup>

July: 100 families called to go strengthen the Bear Lake Valley. [Meadowville MH]

August 1st: Montpelier Relief Society organized. [MH]

August 6th: Meadowville: Settlers arrive in valley. [EH486, MH]

August 29th: First minutes of the High Council recorded. Council met in the Paris meeting house. [Harts. Hart family papers. Microfilm MS 15333]

# 1870

Alonzo Bingham called as Presiding Elder or acting Bishop of **Bennington** by President David P. Kimball. However, meetings occur less frequently due to tensions between the people and the President. [EH, Bennington MH]

**Evanston**: Becomes an official railroad town [EH 238-239]

Josiah Tufts appointed by Elder Rich as first Presiding Elder of *Meadowville*. And as one historian wrote, "prior to [the] ward organization Josiah Tuft was looked up to as the leader and oft times called "Bishop"... "even though no one knew he didn't actually have the priesthood."<sup>18</sup>

**Montpelier**: "Augustus Bingham appointed [to teacher's quorum president] by acting bishop John Cozzen..." <sup>19</sup>

**Woodruff**: George Eastman, the first settler, arrives with others. Town named in honor of Elder Woodruff by Bishop William H. Lee. [EH 963, Woodruff MH]

February 13th: Joseph C. Rich called as a counselor to President David Patten Kimball [EH 47, Stake MH][Harts. Hart family papers. Microfilm MS 15333]

March 14th: **Randolph**: Randolph Hochaday Stewart and company arrived from St. Charles at "Big Creek"<sup>20</sup>

Summer: Almy: founded by non-Mormons when coal was discovered, LDS members arrive to help in the mines and begin meeting in Old Wyoming Camp No. 1 and by common consent appointed John Jolley as presiding Elder, which action was reported to and approved by Elder Charles C. Rich. James McBride and John E. Stones were called as counselors. [EH13-14][MH]

June: *Ovid*: President Edlefsen leaves on a mission to Scandinavia and Peter Jensen takes charge as acting Presiding Elder. <sup>21</sup> [Ovid MH]

- 12 June: President Brigham Young and other leaders visited Soda Springs (unsettled) and constructs a log house to stay at.<sup>22</sup>
- June 13th-18th: President Brigham Young visits the Bear Lake Stake and spoke in Montpelier ("Bishop Cozzens"), Paris, St. Charles, and Bloomington.<sup>23</sup>
- June 13th: Paris: Formed into a regular ward, President Brigham Young calls Henry D. Horne as Bishop due to Alonso Bingham having moved to Bennington. Robert Price and George B. Spencer were called as counselors after the Bishop had acted without counselors for a time. [Paris MH] *WW and FDR journals do not mention this event any time during their visit*
- 17 June: BY and Church leaders, hold meetings at "Ithica Laketown or Last Chance." <sup>24</sup> "Ira Nebeker presides at Ithica"
- 19 June: Apostle FD Richards (part of BY's company) visits Liberty at "Ed. Austin's the Bishop" <sup>25</sup>
- June 24th: William Budge called by President Brigham Young via letter to be "Presiding Bishop of Rich County." He also sends a corresponding letter to "Presidents C.C. Rich and D.P. Kimball" Kimball Kimb
- July 8th: "Bishop Tufts, of Round Valley..." reports the state of the Valley to the Deseret Evening News. ["Local and Other Matters". Deseret Evening News (July 8, 1870). 3. https://newspapers.lib.utah.edu/details?id=23156618.]
- July 27th: Woodruff: William Lee, who had been called by Elder Rich, arrives in the settlement and is appointed by President David P. Kimball and Bishop William Budge as acting Bishop or Presiding Elder with no counselors. [MH]

## August 19: BY writes "Bishop John A. Hunt, St. Charles" 28

Fall: Almy: Elder Charles C. Rich visits the Saints. James McBride and John E. Stones called as counselors. [MH]

October: Soda Springs: In the October Conference a number of Saints are called to go to the Soda Springs area with their families as missionaries. [Georgetown, Soda Springs MH] November: Soda Springs: some settlers arrive and begin constructing homes, but return with the coming of winter. [MH]

January 1st: "Bishop Budge preached an excellent discourse in the evening..."29

<u>February 23rd</u>: Letter arrives from President Young, "Pres. David P. Kimball, Paris Rich Co. We should be pleased to have you give some attention to the settlement of Soda Springs as it is a very important point with us and as such should be kept a vigilant eye on. " <sup>30</sup> In other letters in 1871, BY addresses "President Rich" and "Elder Kimball."

March 2: First record of teachers quorum in Liberty, Bishop E.N. Austin present.<sup>33</sup>

April 10: BY writes "W.P. Nebeker, Laketown, Rich Co." approving the new name of the settlement.<sup>34</sup> *Formerly Ithica* 

April 22: Wilford Woodruff visits Woodruff (Bishop Lee), Randolph (Bishop Randolph Stewart), where he has a house.<sup>35</sup>

- Summer: *Almy*: President Jolley moves and Samuel Pike succeeds him and calls John Crowther and John Hopkins as counselors. [Almy Ward Manuscript history and historical reports. Microfilm LR 10591 2][EH13-14]
- <u>June 26</u>: Brigham Young holds meetings in Randolph; organizes the ward, R.H. Stewart set apart as Bishop. <sup>36</sup>
- June 26-July 16: President Young and party visit Bear Lake Stake (via the train to Evanston for the first time). In Evanston meet "Pres. David P. Kimball and Bp Wm. Budge with a party of men from Bear Lake…" and join "Elder C.C. Rich" in Woodruff.<sup>37</sup> Hold meetings in Randolph (Bp. "Randolph Stewards"), Laketown ("Bp. Nebiker"), Meadowville, St. Charles,<sup>38</sup> Paris, Montpelier ("Bp. Cousins"), Twin Creek/Georgetown, Soda Springs (recently arrived pioneers are still in wagons).<sup>39</sup> In Soda Springs, they are accompanied by "Prest. C.C. Rich," "Prest. David P. - July 28th: Georgetown: Philemon C. Merrill (Soda Springs Mission President) visits to organize a branch on Twin Creek and calls Henry A Lewis to preside over the branch. <u>January 25th-26th</u>: Bear Lake Stake conference is held. [Sleight, Thomas. Thomas Sleight diaries. Microfilm MS 9406.]

It was thought advisable to take his license from him as the President of that stake of Zion." 30th: "A letter from David P. Kimball resigning his presidency over that stake of Zion." "At the end of the speeches David P. Kimball was retained as President on Trial." *What was the issue?*? Also, 4 patriarchs are ordained.

March 6th: Charles C. Rich writes BY. 55 President Young having expressed he was, "..."...not satisfied with the way Bro. Cozzens at Mont Peeler took care of the tithing..." and President Rich responded, "...The Bishop here has found fault with him also on the same subject, now Bro. Cozzens is naturally a good man and that is all the fault that we have to find him with him, he is careless. There has been some suggestions I believe by Bro. Miesser to have a Bishop appointed at Mont Peelier who would take care of all the tithing on that side of the river under the direction of Bishop Budge.
