Jan 5: Lorin W. Babbitt (then living in SLC) selected as Probate Judge of Beaver County, likely simultaneous to being called to preside there

Feb 6: first settlers arrive at Beaver

Feb 8: Branch organized at Beaver by George A. Smith, PE Simeon F. Howd [CC] Feb 10: George A. Smith organizes a temporary branch at Beaver "until the arrival of President Babbitt," P.E. Simeon F. Howd with counselors.<sup>1</sup>

March 5: Babbitt is leaving SLC for Beaver, which appears to be under the authority of Parowan Stake<sup>2</sup>

March 14: Pres. Dame issues some instructions for the new settlement at Beaver after some indian troubles. "The Presidency of Parowan had no desire to extend an unwarrantable jurisdiction of the new settlement at Beaver, but as Loren Babbitt, the president, had not yet arrived with his company, it was thought that trifling technicalities should not interfere with the general good of the saints. Pres. Dame was sustained...by the citizens of Parowan, as well as those settlers of Beaver at that time in Parowan."

April 12: Lorin W Babbitt (under authority of G.A. Smith?) organizes government for Beaver County<sup>4</sup>

April 13: Lorin W Babbitt (under authority of G.A. Smith?) organizes church in Beaver County with counselors (himself as president?), Philo T. Farnsworth as bishop with counselors<sup>5</sup> Oct 30: "Beaver Branch," mentions being organized around April 5 by LW Babbitt as pres with counselors, P.T. Farnsworth as bishop with counselors, but Farnsworth has moved to Fillmore, and Babbitt is leaving for California.<sup>6</sup>

Nov 7: BY writes Bishop Farnsworth: "We learn ... that President L.W. Babbitt has left for California, and you being at Fillmore leaves them without either President or Bishop. We therefore counsel you to return forthwith to that settlement and act in your office. We have recommended you to the people of that settlement to preside..." [i.e., be President and Bishop] Nov 16: First Presidency excommunicates Babbitt for abandoning Beaver for California, after he
