Apr 10: **Toquerville** settled, sent by Cedar Pres. Isaac Haight, Joshua T. Willis presiding [branch?].<sup>6</sup> About this time, Pinto, Pine Valley, Washington, and Toquerville Branches are attached to Harmony Ward, Cedar Stake

April 10: Toquerville Branch organized [CC]

April: Nephi Johnson finishes wagon road up Hurricane Cliffs, Pocketville [Virgin City] laid out, Branch Pres. Nephi Johnson (appointed by Cedar Pres. Isaac C. Haight), attached to Harmony Ward, Cedar Stake<sup>10</sup>

June: Zadoc K. Judd ordained Bishop of Santa Clara by George A. Smith<sup>11</sup>

July 17: Pinto Branch organized, PE Richard S. Robinson, attached to Santa Clara Ward<sup>12</sup> July 29: Cedar Stake disorganized by George A. Smith.<sup>13</sup> What is the status of the southern wards? Parowan? A letter from Smith (CR 100 397) mentions visiting Cedar City, but doesn't say what he did there.

October 31: mention of "R.D. Covington, Bishop of **Washington**"<sup>14</sup> Pine Valley organized as a branch, PE John Hawley, attached to Santa Clara Ward<sup>15</sup> December: Grafton settled, led by Nathan C. Tenney<sup>16</sup>

Autumn: Adventure is settled by Philip Klinginsmith<sup>17</sup> (hiding out from involvement in Mountain Meadows?)

#### 1861

Duncan's Retreat is settled Mountain Dell is settled

6 April: Statistical Report of Harmony (68 members), Toquerville (68 members), Virgin City (54 members), all under Bishop Wm R. Davies of Harmony <sup>18</sup>

May 24-29: Brigham Young and other leaders make their first visit to this area. <sup>19</sup> Visit with the saints in Pinto, Santa Clara, Tonaquint, Washington, Tokerville, Pocketville [Virgin], Grafton, and Adventure [Rockville]. *No mention of congregation status or leadership.* 

August 9: BY writes to Joshua T. Willes [Toquerville Bishop yet?] and W.R. Davies:<sup>20</sup> Davies is released as bishop of Harmony, Willes is called to "act as bishop in Bishop Davies' Ward"

October Conference: 309 families are called to settle in Washington County, which only had 79 families at the time

Nov 12: "Joshua T. Willis [MMTN-SH4] who is the bishop of this place" [Toquerville, already a ward?]<sup>21</sup>

November 24?: Settlement company reaches **Harrisburg**, 2 or 3 houses, PE Silas Harris under Washington Bishop Robert D. Covington.<sup>23</sup>

November 25: Advance company arrives at the site of St. George, remainder of company arriving a few days later under leadership of Erastus Snow<sup>24</sup>

November 28: Swiss Company arrives at Santa Clara, including some of the great Dixie families: Entz, Frei, Gubler, Hafen, Hirschi, Reber, Staheli, Stucki, Tobler William Fawcett is acting bishop of St. George for 6 months at its founding<sup>25</sup>

April 7: General bishops meeting in SLC includes bishops of Grafton and St. George Wards<sup>31</sup> April 27: Shoal Creek [Hebron] area first settled by Pulsipher and Terry families

June 12: **Harrisburg Branch** organized by Orson Pratt and Erastus Snow, President James Lewis and counselors, attached to Washington Ward<sup>32</sup>

Summer: Gunlock settled by Dudley Leavitt<sup>33</sup>

February: first settlers in Winsor (Mt. Carmel) area [MH]

March: John Nebeker first visits the **Panaca** area over which he presides; apparently he doesn't live there. [MH]

Apr 22: Beaver Dam recently settled, 6 men led by Henry W. Miller<sup>60</sup>

May 5: Conference at St. George<sup>61 mp:700274</sup>

- Sustains Erastus Snow, President of the Southern Mission, along with "High Council of the Southern Mission," and priesthood quorums

May 9: Solomon Angell appointed Presiding Elder of Leeds (then renamed from Bennington) by Erastus Snow<sup>117</sup> See December

May: Clover Valley resettled, led by Lyman L. Woods 118

June 7: Erastus Snow helps locate a new site for St. Joseph to replace their burned fort, then visits **West Point**, 15 miles upstream from St. Joseph, then Beaver Dam<sup>119</sup>

Major dispute between residents on the Upper and Lower Muddy and Nevada officials over taxes etc. after surveyors establish the new state boundary.

Jan 1: Hiram Judd set apart as bishop of **Kanab** and **Pahreah** by Snow, Young, and Bleak. He had been called Dec 26 by Jacob Hamblin as part of the Indian mission. 137

March 27: At the ordination of William G. Perkins as stake patriarch, guests include "Joseph W. Young and James G. Bleak of the Presidency of the Southern Mission Stake of Zion" 138

April 24: mentions **Shunesburg**, a branch of the Rockville Ward <sup>139</sup>

June 4: Conference. 140 700308

If the people of these western settlements are willing to go together in a body on the Sevier or Upper Kanab and make a strong settlement. as for keeping this in secrecy is of no use for it is known at the present time among outsiders. ... The Orderville Cotton Farm was across the Virgin River from Washington [Washington Fields], 2 or 3 miles southeast of Washington. [Perhaps the earlier site of Morristown?]<sup>255</sup> 2 miles downstream from the Washington Dam.

Dec 31: St. George Stake includes 14 wards, 816 families, 4592 members. In its first year, St. George temple performed 30,384 baptisms for the dead, 1,116 living endowments, 13,168 endowments for the dead, 475 living sealings, 4,101 sealings for the dead, 327 living sealings to parents; 238 sealings to parents for the dead; 27 living adoptions; 30 adoptions for the dead; 231 living second anointings, 194 second anointings for the dead.<sup>256</sup>

Grafton Ward organized, bishop Alonzo H. Russell [EH, MH]<sup>257</sup> Unlikely given the conference sustainings; other secondary sources suggest this may have happened as late as 1884
