1849-03-12: In a public meeting, Brigham Young calls for a company to settle in Utah Valley. 
1849-03-13: In GSLC, a company intending to go to **Utah Valley** meet at the President's office. 
John S. Higbee is chosen for president and bishop of the company, with two counselors. (*JHC* 1849-03-13 p.1, *JHC* 1849-03-17 p.1)<sup>2</sup>

1849-04-01: John S. Higbee and his party, from the 13th of March, settled on the **Provo river**. (*JHC* 1849-04-18 p.1)

1849-05-28: John Higbee wishes to return to his family, so Isaac Higbee called by Brigham Young as the "president of the settlement in **Utah Valley**." He is asked to call counselors.<sup>4</sup> [gap in *Short History* 1849-1852]

Spring: first settlers at Mountainville (Alpine)<sup>5</sup>

August: settlements begun in Evansville (Lehi), McArthursville (American Fork), Pleasant

20 October: Hobble Creek (Springville) settled [EH, MH, CC 40] informally led by Aaron Johnson

Winter: first settlers at **Spanish Fork** 

December 20: Meeting at Peteetneet [**Payson**]. "Pres. G.A. Smith spoke and said he thought the brethren in this settlement should organize a branch of the Church under the name of the Peteetneet Branch. Br. [James] Pace was chosen president of the branch. . . he would advise the Brethren to ask for a bishop and for the brethren to pay their tithing" 6

# January 12: Brigham Young addresses Isaac Higbee as "Bishop Higbee"<sup>7</sup>

Feb: George S. Clark, reminiscing in 1890: "Settled in P.G. in Feb 1851, was then appointed Bishop of the North End of Utah Co. by Brigham Young, was ordained a high priest and to the office of bishop under the hands of George A. Smith." But Smith was in Parowan at this time Feb 15: David Evans called to lead the **Dry Creek Settlement** (Lehi), the settlers move from Sulphur Springs to his new site, called Evansville

March: David Evans set apart as bishop of Evansville<sup>9</sup> *Histories say George A. Smith ordained him, but Smith was in Parowan at this time. Could it have been March 1852 when Smith was presiding in Utah County?* 

March 18: Brigham Young visits Evansville [**Lehi**], McArthursville [**American Fork**] and stay at **Pleasant Grove**. It is possible that the latter branch was organized at this time. The parentheticals were added later; it is very possible that McArthursville was not American Fork, as Duncan McArthur settled in between American Fork and Pleasant Grove (near the current American Fork High School).

March 19: Meeting in the schoolhouse in Utah Fort, led by Brigham Young. "We are about to organize this place with high council, bishop, &c." BY suggests the following for high council: Stephen Perry, Thomas Guymon, Aaron Johnson, Wm Miller, Peter W. Conover, Wm Pace, Alex Williams, Thos Willis, John Banks, Sam'l Clark, James Ivie, Elias Blackburn. Tho's Willis, Harlo Redfield, Peter Conover, and Is. Higbee nominated for pres't of "this place." Isaac Higbee is not unanimous, but carries. Revised high council: Asahel Perry [SV], Tho's Guyman [SV], Aaron Johnson [SV], Wm Miller [SV], Peter W. Conover, Wm Pace [SF?], Alex Williams, John Banks, Samuel Clark, James Ivie, James A. Smith, & Gordon C. Case (rejected) David Canfield appointed. "Elias Blackburn was then named to be a Bishop in this place." Higbee nominated John Blackburn & Thos Willis as his counselors. 10 Mp:700884

March 19: President Young presiding at Utah Fort, "the people reelected Isaac Higbee to be the president of the **Branch in Utah**, and organized a high council for this **stake**, namely [12 names]. Elias Blackburn was elected to be the bishop of the place" with 2 counsellors. (DN 1851-05-03 p.250)

March 19: "elected Isaac Higbee to be pres't of the **stake <br/>branch> in Utah**. Organized a high council for this **stake**, namely . . ." (Thomas Bullock, *Extracts from Brigham Young Journal*, *1851*, Church History Library CR 1234 1 box 73 folder 3 p.2)

March 20: "Isaac Higbee ordained as Pres. of this Branch of the Church" (then counselors) "Elias Blackburn ordained a H.P. set apart as Bishop of this Place", then William Young and Harlo Redfield as counselors. Ordained as high councillors "in this stake:" Banks, Conover, Pace, Ivie, Canfield, Smith, Williams, Clark. Of the 14, 6 were ordained high priests as well. 11 March 20: President Young "ordained Isaac Higbee as president of the branch and ... his counsellors. Ordained Elias Blackburn a high priest and bishop of the branch, and [counselors]." Then set apart 8 "counsellors in this stake of Zion." [8 of the twelve called the day before]

March 20: evening meeting at "Hobble Creek School House." BY: "Bro. Johnson has presided here. It is for you to select a P't and his co's, appoint a bishop who will select his cr's. There are 4 chosen last night to be co's in Provo." "It was voted that Asahel Perry [KWJ5-GJC] be the presiding officer in this branch...That Aaron Johnson be the bishop." Noah Packard & Stephen Perry as Perry's counselors, Wm Miller & Myron Crandell as Johnson's counselors. March 20: Travel to Springville, have a meeting in the evening. "ordained Asahel Perry as president of the **branch at Springville** and . . . his counsellors; Aaron Johnson to be the **bishop of the branch** and . . . his counsellors. ordained [4 brethren] as members of the **high council in Provo City**." these 4 were those of the 12 called the day before but not ordained in Provo, including President Perry, Bishop Johnson, William Miller, and Thomas Guymon, all

1851-03-23: "A meeting was held in the fort at noon." Benjamin Cross "was ordained a High Priest, and set apart as Bishop over **Payson Branch**." 12

Clark [KWJC-2KM] "to visit the Saints in the vicinity of Pleasant Grove and receive from them their tithing, and account for the same to the General Tithing Office in Great Salt Lake City, and he also authorized to preach the Gospel in all branches in these valleys." *This effectively appoints him as acting bishop. Written by Thomas Bullock.* 

Thomas Bullock's minutes of the meetings, partially written in shorthand; so this is the most primary source possible of what happened. The other sources below, many of which were also written by Bullock, are based on this.

March 30: Membership report for **Springville**, "Asahel Perry President" <sup>14</sup> April 22: PB Edward Hunter writes to outlying bishops, about "your ward or district", including "Isaac Higbee [Provo]" but no others in Utah Valley <sup>15</sup>

April: David Evans ordained bishop of Dry Creek Ward (Lehi) by George A. Smith (but Smith is

May 25: "Meeting of the Inhabitants living near the **American Creek** held at Hyrum Motts May 25th 1851. Meeting open'd by prayer. Elder John Banks Chosen to preside [over the meeting]; meeting appointed for the organizing the people into a **branch** of the Church Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints Whereupon Leonard E. Harrington was chosen Presiding [acting] Bishop of the same & Arza Adams, & James Guyman Councilors & John S. Eldredge, clerk." <sup>16</sup> June 16: A Stake of Zion is already organized at **Fort Utah**, with a "High Council and other officers." (JH 1851-06-16 p.1)

Summer: first settlers at Summit Creek [Santaquin] led by Benjamin F. Johnson (PE??) [MH]

Sep 1: **Payson Branch** has a branch presidency and a bishopric for 116 baptized members, Pres. James Pace with counselors, Bishop Benjamin Cross with counselors. <sup>17</sup> Lists most rebaptisms prior to August 1851 as happening at Peteetneet.

Sep 5: **Springville** report, "Asahel Perry President of the Branch" with counselors, "Aaron Johnson Bishop" with counselors 18

Sep 6: Report from Isaac Higbee, president of the "Branch of the Church in Provo City." 328 members<sup>19</sup>

"Clark, George Sheffer, first bishop of Pleasant Grove, Utah County, was ordained to that position in 1851 by Prest. George A. Smith; previously, the same year, he was appointed to the Bishopric of the northern end of Utah County by Prest. Brigham Young."<sup>20</sup>

September: report from "**Pleasant Grove** Ward" by "G.S. Clark – Presiding Bishop," 70 members. <sup>21</sup>

1851-09-14: "John Redford was appointed recorder for the **Provo City Church**" 22 1851-10-22: mentions "American River at Bishop Harrington's" [**American Fork**] 23 October 23: George S. Clark writes to family members, "George is Bishop and President of this [**Pleasant Grove**] Ward." 24

Nov 16?: "Pleasant Grove & Battle Creek: A list of those who have been rebaptized in the branch since coming to the valley." most baptisms are in American Creek, a few in Utah Lake or Battle Creek. No leaders mentioned, but George S. Clark is first in the list (often a sign of the presiding authority), and almost all baptisms performed by James Guymon (AF Branch) and George S. Clark, some by Hanson Walker. NO YEAR GIVEN IN REPORT, last date is "Nov 16" 1851-11-21..1859-02-24: Bishop Blackburn records bishops courts; not sure if this is a higher court than others, but rare indication of jurisdiction beyond Provo: Springville (1851) (*Elias H. Blackburn Papers*, Folder 5) Book lists members of 3rd Ward in January 1854

Dec 4: BY writes to "David Evans, Bishop of Dry Creek" [Lehi]26

December 21: Settlers at **Spanish Fork** organize themselves into "Spanish Fork Branch," President Stephen Markham with counselors, Bishop William Pace with counselors.<sup>27</sup> Dec 22: A third baptism report from Springville, President Asahel Perry and counselors<sup>28</sup> December 27: Benjamin F. Johnson writes from "Summit City" [Santaquin] about their new settlement.<sup>29</sup>

Jan 26: BY writes letters to James Pace (President of Payson Branch) and the High Council at Provo. The high council had disfellowshipped Pace and others; they appealed to Brigham

Young, and he has accepted to hear the case at General Conference.<sup>30</sup> Thus, the Provo High Council has jurisdiction over Payson.

Feb 3: BY clarifies the Provo issue, stating a policy that "the High Council have power to disfellowship the President of a Stake or Branch, or any other person within their jurisdiction; as also has the President and his Council, to disfellowship the High Council. The [General] Conference has not only the power, but also the right to arraign both the High Council, and President, and his Council and settle the matter for them."<sup>31</sup>

Feb 4: Thomas Bullock summons Benjamin Cross (Payson Bishop) to a meeting of the disputing parties and the Provo High Council at the High Council in Great Salt Lake City [Salt Lake Stake HC? Or Quorum of the Twelve?]. 32

Feb 5: Lehi incorporated. Did the branch change its name at this time?

Feb 10: **Mountainville** Branch [Alpine] organizes itself with President Charles S. Peterson.<sup>33</sup> Feb 20: "Bishop Clark wrote from **Pleasant Grove**, **Utah County**…" In his letter, he mentions the councilors and clerk. (JH)

Feb 25: Bishop Harrington attends bishops meeting in GSLC. "Wanted to know if a sectional organization could not be entered into where a number of the neighboring bishops could assemble and make reports to an individual that might be appointed to preside." \*\* Is he asking for a stake organization for northern Utah County, or just a regional bishops council? Also at this meeting is Bishop Aaron Johnson of Springville Ward, and David "Ivins" of Dry Creek Ward Feb 29: In American Fork, "The Bishop also stated he had been to the city and received his ordination as bishop of the ward." \*\* first time the ward record calls itself a "Ward" instead of a "branch."

April 19: Utah County Court establishes school districts, lining up with the settlements of Dry Creek/Lehi City, Lott Settlement [Saratoga Springs], Mountainville/Upper Dry Creek [Alpine], **American Fork Ward, Pleasant Grove Ward, Provo 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th Municipal Wards**, Springville Survey, Spanish Fork Survey, Peteetneet Survey, Summit Creek Survey.<sup>39</sup> *These surveys would provide a good contemporary source for the intended extent of the wards.* 1852-05-22: Brigham Young: "I received a petition from 126 persons in Provo for a new organization of **that stake**, and praying that Elder George A. Smith might be appointed to preside there."

May 26: Isaac Higbee writes to BY, denying many of the charges about his leadership that were apparently in the petition, but is fine with George A. Smith coming to preside.<sup>41</sup>

May 30: "G. A. Smith and a portion of his family are about to locate themselves at **Provo**, **Utah County**, and he has been appointed to preside over that branch."<sup>42</sup>

July 15: Conference at Evansville, attended by BY, HCK, Orson Pratt, George A Smith<sup>43</sup> 1852-07-18: Conference held. BY appoints George A. Smith as president of the "stake" to replace Isaac Higbee (with Higbee's support). "GAS nominated Isaac Higbee and Dominicus Carter as his counselors, carried." High Council "of this stake" sustained: Asahel Perry (Springville), Thomas Guymon (Springville), James A. Smith (Provo), Samuel Clark (Provo),

James Ivie, Alex Williams, A. Johnson (Springville), Wm. Pace (SF?), John Banks (PG?), P.W. Conover, David Canfield, Wm Miller (Springville). Bishops: "Elias Blackburn was sustained as Bishop of 3rd Ward; Jonathan O. Duke '' 1st Ward; James Bird '' 2nd Ward; Wm Wall '' 4th Ward; Wm Fossitt for Ward at the mouth of Provo Creek"44 E.H. Blackburn retains some duties of a presiding bishop (Blackburn registry) Mouth of Provo Creek? Is that north of Provo, or West? Fausett eventually becomes bishop of the 4th Ward, which suggests north. 1852-07-19: Bowery erected in Pleasant Grove "for the occasion, and at two o'clock the meeting was called to order by President Young. 45 After being opened by singing and prayer, he asked for some person to explain the difficulties which were rumoured concerning the Bishop. but there was not any present; on inquiries being made, the people voted to sustain George S. Clark as the Bishop of the ward." Some discussion on whether they want a separate presiding elder. "On motion, Henson Walker was voted to be the Presiding Elder of the Pleasant Grove Branch." July 19. **Battle Creek** conference. BY references rumored difficulties in the branch: Geo Clark is bishop of the ward, Duncan McArthur has been presiding, but the branch "was not regularly organized," and apparently some contention over who is in charge. BY: "for the present, let the boundaries of the wards remain as they are" (American Fork, Pleasant Grove). Congregation sustains Clark as Bishop. After sermons, Bro. Henson Walker was nominated as presiding elder of the Pleasant Grove branch, sustained. GAS speaks, possibly as stake president.<sup>46</sup> July 28: G.A. Smith stays in "**Leehi**" on his way to live in Provo.<sup>47</sup>

July 29: G.A. Smith arrives in Provo

1852-08-01: G.A. Smith calls and ordains bishops and counselors for **1st Ward** of Provo (Jonathan O. Duke) and **4th Ward** of Provo (William Madison Wall)<sup>48</sup> <sup>49</sup> (*Short History*, p.1)

1852-08-15: G.A. Smith ordains bishop and counsellors of **2nd Ward** of Provo (James Bird) and a counsellor to bishop Wm Fausett of the **5th Ward**  $^{52}$   $^{53}$ 

1852-08-16: groundbreaking for Meeting house on the Public Square (*Short History* p.1)

1852-08-22: G.A. Smith ordains 2nd counselor of **4th Ward**, and makes Dominicus Carter and Isaac Higbee his own counselors (what about stake presidency?) (*Short HIstory* p.2) No records in *Utah Stake General Minutes*, 1852-08-22 to 1855-06

Sep 18: "A General meeting or conference in American Fork...of the inhabitants of American Fork, Evansville, Pleasant Grove, & Mountainville," presided by "Pres't" G.A. Smith, who says he has been "appointed to the County of Utah". 54 George S. Clark ordained Bishop (**Pleasant Grove**)<sup>55</sup> Bishop Blackburn (Provo) speaks but it is not clear whether he is PB over this area. Sep 19: North county conference continues: "Bro. [Isaac] Houston of Alpine was then ordained to the office of Bishop by Pres. G.A. Smith."56 Smith and others occasionally call all of these "wards." So Smith has authority over the entire county, although there is no hint in this record if the high council does. Did Bishop Houston replace President Peterson or dual-leader? Sep 27: In a letter to Samuel Richards, George A. Smith says the following: "I was appointed by the Presidency of the Church to preside over the Saints in **Utah county**, which is the second in population in the Territory. The settlements extend in this county a distance of about fifty miles. The different Branches are known as Mountainville, Lehi city, American Fork, Battle creek, Provo city, Springville, Palmyra city, Payson, and Summitville." "In Springville there is a school-house building... School-houses have been erected in almost every neighbourhood."57 October 1: "Minutes of the Semi-annual Conference of Provo Stake of Zion held at Provo City. . . present President George A. Smith and John Taylor of the Quorum of the Twelve, Isaac Higbee and Dominicus Carter counsellors to the President; N.H. Felt travelling bishop . . . most of the high council, the President and council and most of the bishops of this stake."58 October 3: "presented President Geo A Smith as Travelling Presiding High Councilor of this county and his counsel to wit Isaac Higbee & Dominicus Carter, carried, also Prest of the stake Isaac Higbee & counsel to wit John Blackburn & J.T. Willis, carried, also the high counsel, which

October 4: James S. Holman "ordained a bishop to preside over the branch of the church at **Summit** City, Utah County [Santaquin]" by George A. Smith, J.L. Heywood & Isaac Higbee<sup>61</sup> Does not appear in Smith's journal

October 5: G.A. Smith lays out a plat for **American Fork**, then visits Bishop Houston in Mountainville.<sup>62</sup> Lays out a town plat for Mountainville.

October 6: Church Statistical Report only gives one report for "Provo Stake, Isaac Higbee" (president?), 2751 members. This membership definitely includes the entire county. A draft report includes a list of the settlements that are crossed out, along with George A. Smith as president.

1852-10-14: In SLC, B. Young calls G.A. Smith to return to Iron County to "preside over the affairs of that section" and survey Cedar City. 63

1852-10-18: G.A. Smith writes to David Evans nominating Charles Hopkins as **president of the branch at Lehigh City**, "it being the unanimous choice of the people." <sup>64</sup>

1852-10-20: G.A. Smith, as he leaves Utah County for the south, writes to Asahel Perry "Advising him to appoint Lorenzo Johnson to preside at Springville." \*Go Unclear if he ever served Late November, G.A. Smith returns from his visit to Iron County. In December, he attends the legislature as a delegate from Iron County. Apparently, he still has oversight there as well. 1852-12-19: Elders Lyman and Rich wrote an article in the Deseret News about their travels and said the following: "We called at **Payson**, but to our astonishment, we did not find the Saints here as at other places; whether their Presidency and Bishoprick is dead, temporal or spiritual, or both we cannot say, but we feel certain they cannot be alive; we have no doubt but the Saints would be Saints indeed if they had a President and Bishop to take them by the hand and lead them; we stopped at **Springville**, where we were received by Bishop Miller and the Saints..." (JH p.2)

1852-12-31: Bishops statistical reports for Y.E. 1852 lists "Provo Stake" led by Isaac Higbee, but not itemized into wards

# 1853

January 1: school house dedicated in **Palmyra Branch**. "Proposed by Bro. Markham that inasmuch as the bishop Bro. Pace lived so far from the town, that Bro. John Wm Berry act as bishop for Palmyra in the absence of Bro. Pace." *Markham is not called President in this page, but he is a couple pages later.* 

January 18: At a presiding bishops meeting, "Bishop Harrington reported ... the Ward over which he presided at **American Creek**." "Bishop Pace, from **Spanish Fork** Settlement" 69

January 30 etc.: Bishop William Pace is clearly still part of **Palmyra Branch**, and acts as Bishop whenever possible, even though he is not living nearby (apparently, in the upper Spanish Fork valley, closer to the current city).<sup>70</sup>

February 22: "President George A. Smith" visits Palmyra Branch. 71

March 3: **Springville** (branch? ward?) baptism report, President Asahel Perry<sup>72</sup> *The bishop is never mentioned in these; so in a dual-leader unit, the president was responsible for membership records?* 

March 22: up to this date, **Palmyra** was consistently called a branch in this record, but "A meeting of **Spanish Fork Ward** was called on the evening of the 22nd of March for the purpose of dividing the ward and appointing a bishop for the new ward by Pres. Geo A. Smith." Stephen Markham is ordained the bishop, with counselors. <sup>73</sup> *Presumably, the other ward is Spanish Fork under Bishop William Pace.* 

"There was some difficulty during the winter between the bishop and his councilor, and Geo A. Smith one of the twelve apostles had to come up to Palmyra to settle it. It I think originated about another man's wife, which the Bishop afterwards was sealed to. Geo A Smith at the time of settling the foregoing, divided the ward, making two: Palmyra City one, and what was then called Upper Settlement the other: Appointing Stephen Markham and ordaining him bishop of Palmyra Ward, and Pace remaining bishop of the other. At the foregoing organization which was March 22d AD 1853, I was chosen and ordained an high priest and first councilor to the bishop."

March 25: Stephen Markham ordained "a bishop for the town of **Palmyra**" by George A. Smith<sup>75</sup> April 3: "The Saints who had settled in **Cedar Valley**, **Utah**, were organized into a Ward; Allen Weeks, [Acting] Bishop. (JH p.1, CC, MH)

April 6: Church Statistical Report. <sup>76</sup> Same as October 1852, except dual presidents not listed, and:

- Palmyra City: President of Branch & Bishop Stephen Markham
- **Spanish Fork Ward**: Bishop Wm Pace (no other leaders listed; this seems to be a less organized unit, possibly dependent on Palmyra)
- Payson City: President pro tem James McClellan, Bishop Benjamin Cross
- Summit Creek Ward: Bishop James Holman (no other leaders listed)
- Cedar Valley Ward: Bishop Allen Weeks
- Lake City: President of Branch & Bishop Leonard E. Harrington
- Pleasant Grove Ward: Bishop G.S. Clark, President Henson Walker
- It seems like the ones called "Wards" are new/minor settlements, with the major settlements titled "City". Mountainville not listed.

Dec: **American Fork Ward** sustains L.E. Harrington as "Bishop & President of the Ward." 1853-12-22: "Elder Henson Walker was ordained a High Priest and Bishop and set apart to preside in **Pleasant Grove**, **Utah County**, by Heber C. Kimball and Geo. A. Smith in the President's Office." (JH) George S. Clark has left for southern Utah.

Between October 1853 and April 1854: Bishop William M. Wall of Provo 3<sup>rd</sup> Ward called on a mission to Australia, William Faucett (former bishop of 5<sup>th</sup> Ward) appointed the new bishop [MH] Wall was called on a mission in February 1856, and was fighting in the Walker War at this time. Yet Fausett is listed as bishop after this—so Wall may have been released for a reason other than a mission.

### 1854

Height of the Walker War in Utah County

March 24: BY writes to "Bishop Cross, Payson," mentions "your ward" 84

April 6: Church statistical report.85 Same wards/leaders as previous October, except:

- Dry Creek (Lehi), no report. Report for Dry Creek Ward in separate reports does not mention President Hopkins, but there isn't a space on the form for a president. 86
- Mountainville, Isaac Houston
- Pleasant Grove, Hanson Walker
- Provo 4<sup>th</sup>, William Fausett
- Payson called a "branch" in separate report
- Spanish Fork still not reported

April 7: At general conference, BY calls George A. Smith as Church Historian and Recorder. While he retains a home (and a wife) in Provo, he ceases to function as the stake/region president, and Isaac Higbee becomes the de facto president.<sup>87</sup>

- Springville
- Mountainville

May 6: BY and others visiting "Battle Creek Fort," mentions "Bishop H. Walker"89

May 7: BY company visits Provo, mentions "Bishop Richards"

May 24: 34th Quorum of Seventies organized in Provo under the direction of Pres. Joseph

Young. (Elias H. Blackburn Papers, BYU Special Collections, Mss 785, Folder 1)

May 31: List of wards south of GSL City, with bishops, counselors, and clerk (and several measures of development, like the size of the fort, schools, and whether shade trees have been planted). It is clear that by this time, this is the general pattern.<sup>90</sup>

Summer: After being refused by GA Smith, **Spanish Fork** Upper Settlement residents obtain permission from Brigham Young to build a new fort closer to them where 300 S Main in Spanish Fork is now, which they call "Fort St. Luke" for reasons nobody remembers.<sup>91</sup>

5 Nov: American Fork holds a conference. <sup>92</sup> L.E. Harrington sustained as "Bishop of this *Branch* & *Ward.*" *However, throughout the rest of the record at this time, it exclusively calls itself a ward.* November 12-22: G. A. Smith takes speaking tour through Utah County wards, <u>from GSLC</u>, clearly not presiding there anymore.

December: Several new post offices announced, including "Taylorsville (Mountainville)." This name did not persist.<sup>93</sup>

Dec 19: BY writes to the Utah County bishops:94

- David Evans, Dry Creek
- L.E. Harrington, American Fork
- Hanson Walker, Pleasant Grove
- Elias Blackburn, Provo
- A. Johnson, Springville
- Stephen Markham, Palmyra

Dec 25: Bishop Benjamin Cross of Payson dies<sup>95</sup>

During 1854 and 1855, "Bishop Alfred Cordon" frequently appears in American Fork. He is one of Edward Hunter's traveling bishops, not bishop of Willard yet. He seems to have more direct authority here than the stake officials in Provo. During these years (1852-1855), there is no mention in the American Fork Ward Historical Record of any stake officials visiting from Provo; instead, home missionaries from neighboring north county settlements are common. During 1854, the settlement in **Cedar Valley** is frequently called "Stone City." Is this Cedar Fort?

### 1855

1855-01-01: **Springville City** have a New Years celebration with "a procession as follows; -- 1st, Captain John Taylor, with brass band.

. . .

5th, President A. Perry, and Councilors,

6th, Bishop, and Councilors." (JH p.1)

Feb 12: Allen Weeks ordained "Bishop of Fort Cedar in **Cedar Valley**" by Edward Hunter<sup>98</sup> *He must have been an acting bishop prior to this* 

1855-03-04..8: E.T. Benson & G.A. Smith tour Utah County wards, including the "branch at Provo", on their way to Parowan

March 6: Report of Geo. A. Smith on travel in Utah County: "Elder Chas. B. Hancock was unanimously chosen **Bishop of Payson**, to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Benj. Cross, and we ordained him. The branch organization was discontinued, and the Bishop directed to <a href="mailto:preside">preside</a>" with two counselors. "After partaking of their hospitality, we proceeded to the Fort of the

newly incorporated **City of Spanish Fork**, and were very kindly received by Bishop Wm. Pace." Also mentions visits to Springville, Palmyra, Provo, Lake City, Pleasant Grove, Lehi, and Mountainville, but no indication of organization.<sup>99</sup>

March 11: Census of population of **Palmyra Ward**: 254 members and authorities 100

April 6: Church statistical report. 101 Same wards/leaders as previous April, except:

- Lehi (instead of Dry Creek), David Evans
- Spanish Fork, William Pace (and Palmyra still listed)
- Payson, Charles B. Hancock

April 6: General conference "voted that Isaac Higbee be dropped as President of the **Stake of Provo**, in Utah County; and that James C. Snow fill that office. Conference voted that Asahel Perry (who has been ordained a patriarch) be relieved from the duties of president of the branch at Springville, and that Aaron Johnson be the president of said **branch at Springville**." Apr: General bishops meeting includes bishops from Lehi, Lake City, Provo, Pleasant Grove, Springville, Spanish Fork, Palmyra City, and Cedar Valley Wards. 103

May 27: first record in *Stake General Minutes* 2nd period, talk by Bishop E.H. Blackburn and "President [James C.] Snow" <sup>104</sup>

3 June: "Bro. Wm. M. Wall" reports on the Indians. <sup>105</sup> Has he already been released as bishop of 3<sup>rd</sup> Ward?

June 24: in a meeting of the seventies, during discussion of what if any local authority they have, it is mentioned the "Bro. J.C. Snow has superseded Bro. Geo A. Smith in the Pres'dcy of this County" 106

July 13: "Special Conference at Provo City, Pres't B. Young." Among other things, Young reprimands the saints for building some of their towns in different locations than where he told them. <sup>107</sup> According to the JHC 7/15/1855, at this conference James C. Snow is officially sustained as president, with Dominicus Carter and James N. Jones as counselors. July 16: at the recent conference, "Pres. J.C. Snow chose his counselors, Bro. Dominicus Carter & James N. Jones." <sup>108</sup> Bishop Duke (Provo 1st) mentions having "ward prayer meetings" (at his house), children's blessing meetings, and bishops courts, but not Sunday sacrament meeting

July 27: GA Smith visits the settlements in Utah Valley: Provo "President J.C. Snow," Payson "Bishop Charles B. Hancock," Palmyra, Springville "President Aaron Johnson", Spanish Fork "Bishop Wm. Pace" 109

August 5: In regular Sunday meeting, JC Snow ordains James N. Jones a high priest and "his second counsellor to this stake of Zion." <sup>110</sup>

24 August: David Pettigrew (prez. HP Quorum, Salt Lake Stake?) visits Mountainville, Bishop Isaac Houston; Lehi, Bishop Evans; Battle Creek, Bishop Walker; Springville, Bishop A. Johnson; Payson, Bishop Charles W. Hancock; American Fork, Bishop L.E. Harrington. Pettigrew advises and organizes High Priests in these settlements, clearly asserting authority beyond Salt Lake Stake.

September 2: Meeting of High Priests in Provo, General President David Pettigrew calls Emer Harris "to preside over the High Priests in this City." <sup>112</sup>

September 23: Census of population of **Palmyra Ward**: 249 members and authorities. 113 October 6: Statistical report lists "wards" with "bishops," including MountainvilleLone City: I Houston, Lehi: D Evans, Cedar Valley (no report), American Fork: LE Harrington, Pleasant Grove: H Walker, Provo 1: JO Duke, Provo 2: J Bird, Provo 3: EH Blackburn, Provo 4:W Fawcett, Springville: A Johnson, Spanish Fork: W Pace, Palmyra: S Markham, Payson: CB Hancock. 114 Separate unit reports in same file says that "Lone City" was suggested by Pres. H.C. Kimball

8 Oct: General bishops meeting has representatives from wards including Provo, Springville, Palmyra, American Fork, Spanish Fork, Pleasant Grove. 115 Note both Palmyra and Spanish Fork. There is also a "Lone Ward," which is probably Alpine

October 26: Conference. Appears to be the introduction of local missionaries.<sup>116</sup> American Fork mentions many of its members attending, strengthening that it was part of the stake.<sup>117</sup> Nov 7: "council of the bishops of the county"<sup>118</sup>

December 1: Conference at Palmyra School House. Appears to be led by Wm. Snow & A. Farr, some of the local missionaries<sup>119</sup>

3-4 December: Several apostles hold meetings in Lehi and Spanish Fork [not Palmyra] on their way to the legislature in Fillmore. 120 These are probably not home mission quarterly conferences, and no local leaders are mentioned.

Dec 22: Bishop Wm Miller (Provo High Council? Presiding Bishop?) organizes an Elder's quorum in Springville, Pres. Gardiner Curtis<sup>121</sup>

### 1856

January 27: In discussing sustaining local leaders, James C. Snow speaks of bishops almost exclusively; it is clear that by this point, they are the primary authorities, at least in the outlying settlements. The fact that all of Provo is still meeting every Sunday suggests that the 4 Provo wards are less congregational. 122

"In February of this year John W. Berry went to see Pres. Brigham Young on business. Whilst there a conversation arose in regard to Palmyra and it was the feeling of the President to have the place broken up and recommended that the brethren through him [Berry] to move to the new location of Spanish Fork." 123

William Pace called on a mission to Britain

February?: "Pres James C. Snow and D Carter came here [Spanish Fork] and appointed J.L. Butler and J.W. Berry to be presiding officers in this ward with instructions for them to be united in their moves and council. This was reported to the President and he sustained it and appointed J.L. Butler Bishop of Spanish Fork Ward." \*Some secondary sources (MH) say that JW Berry was called as president, but this doesn't say so particularly. In the next entry they are called "Bp. & Councilor." Bill Hartley says Butler probably thought he was just acting bishop in Pace's stead at first.

February 23: Brigham Young writes the saints at Palmyra: "Bishop Markham ... desiring counsel concerning the removal of your City location to the Bluffs at **Spanish Fork City**. The first presidency...it was unanimously decided that this would be best for you to remove to the bluffs [Spanish Fork] and use your present city flat for farming purposes." That is, merge the two settlements

February 24: 4<sup>th</sup> Ward Bishop William M. Wall called on a mission to India. 126 *The Indian Mission was closed, and he ended up serving in Australia.* 

March 14: President J.C. Snow speaks at American Fork. 127 This is the first time this record mentions him visiting in anything like a presiding role.

Spring: First permanent settlers in Pond Town (Salem), most coming from Palmyra. 128

Spring: Summit Creek [Santaquin] resettled, Bishop James S. Holman returns, President Benjamin F. Johnson [MH]

March 29: Final record of **Palmyra Ward**. 129 Bishop Stephen Markham was probably released about this time.

April 6: Report of members of "the Branch of the Church at South Creek, Cedar County" [Fairfield], Pres. William Cumington. 130

April-May: "The Bishop [Butler] went to Salt Lake City to see the president who ordained him to be Bishop of Spanish Fork Ward and gave him a letter of instruction and of council to the brethren." <sup>131</sup>

April 26: "Quarterly Conference for the Provo Stake of Zion.": speakers included Bishops Aaron Johnson [Springville], L.E. Harrington [AF], E.H. Blackburn [Provo 3rd], David Evans [Lehi], and Presidents James C. Snow [Provo], David Fullmer [Salt Lake Stake]. High council is completely reorganized. 132

May 13: William M. Wall (4<sup>th</sup> Ward Bishop) leaves on his mission to Australia <sup>133</sup> May 29: BY to "Bishop John L. Butler," authorizing him to collect all the records from his predecessors in **Spanish Fork/Palmyra**: Stephen Markham and Wm. Pace <sup>134</sup> This confirms that he is the new permanent bishop, if "acting." An attached letter to the members instructs the two settlements to stop bickering, move together, and work together to improve the town and surrounding fields. <sup>135</sup>

June 1: JL Butler reads Young's letter to the **Spanish Fork** Ward and is sustained as bishop and JW Berry as 1<sup>st</sup> Counselor. He calls GW Wilkins as 2nd counselor. <sup>136</sup> *Did this obliviate Berry's call as President if he ever was? He is the go-to for temporary presiding in later years.* June 12: BY writes the southern bishops, including "David Evans, Dry Creek; L E Harrington, American Fork; William Walker, Pleasant Grove; Elias Blackburn and the Bishops in Provo City; Aaron Johnson, Springville; John Butler, Spanish Fork; Charles Hancock, Payson." <sup>137</sup> *Does not mention Mountainville, Cedar Valley, Santaquin, Palmyra* 

June 28: James C. Snow, Dominicus Carter, and Bishop Elias Blackburn visit American Fork, clearly as stake representatives. 138

July 24: Reports of pioneer day festivities include: 139

- Springville: "President Aaron Johnson, Bishop Miller, bishops of several Wards."
- Provo City: "President of the Provo Stake of Zion," "19 Bishops and their counselors, each at the head of the citizens of his ward."
- Spanish Fork City: "Bishop" (no president)
- Payson: "Bishop Charles B. Hancock."

July 26: Conference. 140

August 23: Isaac Houston, bishop of Alpine, dies [CC, MH, Alpine Ward Records]

August 30: Lake City Home Mission Quarterly Conference. 141 Joseph G. Hovey presiding [Home missionary?]; Bishops Evans (Lehi), Harrington (American Fork), and Walker (Pleasant Grove) present, as are "President James C. Snow and Bishop Blackburn of Provo". PB Elias Blackburn counsels members to "honor the Pres of the Stake." Pres. Snow speaks with clear authority over this area, but doesn't preside at the meeting.

September 27-29: Spanish Fork Home Mission Quarterly Conference. Home missionaries are presiding, but J.C. Snow and Bishop John Butler is present; J.W. Berry is listed as his counselor. *Berry left on a mission within a few months, replaced by AK Thurber.* 

7 Oct: General bishops meeting has representatives from wards including American Fork, Pleasant Grove, Provo, Springville, and Payson.<sup>143</sup>

8 October: Edward Hunter and counselors rebaptize and reconfirm several bishops, 144 including:

- Leonard E. Harrington, bishop of Lake City
- John Lowe Butler, bishop of Spanish Fork
- Henson Walker, bishop of Battle Creek
- Aaron Johnson, bishop of Springville
- David Evans bishop of Lehi City
- Allen Weekes, bishop of Cedar Fort

October 16: JC Snow encourages the Fourth ward to build a Ward House. 145

24 October: Provo City has a single High Priests Quorum<sup>146</sup>, Pres. Dominicus Carter, with teachers appointed for each ward. The ward bishops and (stake) President Snow are frequently present and speak.

25 Oct: Home Mission Quarterly Conference in Pleasant Grove. 147 As usual, visiting missionaries preside. President Snow and Bishop Blackburn from Provo present and speak. October 26: mentions a Thursday meeting in the Third Ward. Is that when wards are holding separate meetings? 148

November 15: Conference<sup>149</sup>

November 15: Thomas T. McCullough ordained "Bishop of Alpine City in place of Bishop Isaac Houston, deceased" by Edward Hunter<sup>150</sup>

November 23: Pres. JC Snow gives a talk on bishops. Clearly, Bishops are the primary authority in wards (in Provo at least)<sup>151</sup>

November 29: Provo seems to have a single Elders Quorum, with teachers in each ward. 152 Bishop Blackburn is present and speaks with some authority. "The President" is often mentioned but no name given or indication of whether he is the quorum president or the stake president.

Baptism report from "the Branch of the Church at South Creek [**Fairfield**], Cedar County," President William Cummington. <sup>153</sup>

By the end of 1856, it is fairly clear (but indirectly) from several sources that the stake has jurisdiction over the entire county.

Late 1856-Early 1857: Lycurgas Wilson made the first presiding elder of Pond Town, part of Payson Ward.<sup>154</sup>

## 1857

January 8: talk about block teachers in Provo 155

January 10: In Provo Elders Quorum meetings, "the Danish Elders" are being reported by teachers separate from the other wards. <sup>156</sup> Is it a separate branch? This continues for a few months, then stops.

January 21: Bishop JO Duke (Provo 1st) "commenced to hold block meetings through the ward" 157

New settlers in Goshen Valley build a fort called Sodom, 2.5 miles NW of the present town [MH]

Spring: Pleasant Grove Ward transfers tithing to other wards in the area, including Fort Cedar (Bp. Allen Weeks), Summit Creek (Bp. Holman), Payson/Peteetneet (Bp. CB Hancock), Alpine City (Bp. TJ McCullough), Lehi, Spanish Fork (Bp. Butler), Springville, Provo, American-Lake City, and Goshen (Bp. Cook). 160

June 6: Wilford Woodruff and Orson Hyde visit Pondtown [Salem]. "We organized the pondtown district into a ward and we appointed A.O. Smoot Bishop and to preside over the people in that place." 162 Is this a temporary appointment during the move south? A.O. Smoot is still bishop of Sugar House Ward and mayor of SLC. David P. Rainey appears to have been called as bishop soon after

June 27: Conference, attended by President James C Snow & J.N. Jones, First Presidency and several of the Twelve. 163

July 11: "Pres't James C Snow said in consequence of Bishop E.H. Blackburn being called to take care of the tithing matters on the Bench [Orem??] I have appointed Bishop Wm. M. Wall Bishop Pro Tem of the 3d Ward," sustained unanimously.<sup>164</sup>

August-December: *General Minutes* only records a couple meetings; apparently clerk Lucius Scovill is temporarily away?

Sep 9: Letter to Hyram B. Clawson from "David P. Rainey, Bp., Pond Town" 165

December 26: Alpine Bishop Isaac Houston dies, TJ McCullough takes over 166 See 1856

After the Move South, William McBride replaces James Holman as bishop of Santaquin, President B.F. Johnson is released and no president is continued [MH]

### 1859

February: Edward Hunter ordains David P. Rainey as bishop of Salem/Pond Town [MH]

March 1: President Snow lays out a city plat at Goshen 167

March 6: President Snow's counselors are now Dominicus Carter and Silas Smith. 168

March 21: First presidency writes "Bishop David P. Rainey, **Pond Town**." 169

23 March: Judge Cradlebaugh is holding court in Provo, trying to arrest as many leaders as he can, including President James C. Snow and Aaron Johnson<sup>170</sup>

Cyrus Wheelock is temporarily presiding over **Springville** while Bishop Johnson and other leaders are in hiding.[MH] He may have ceased in the fall when Johnson returned.

May 8: "Elders George A Smith and Ezra T. Benson of the quorum of the Twelve, visited Spanish Fork Ward and held meeting, and set apart John W. Berry as president of Spanish Fork Ward." 171 Butler in his illness had asked for someone else to take charge of Sunday meetings. Albert Thurber is probably also acting as bishop for the time being.

May 15: in his first meeting as president, John W. Berry refers to "the branch." Bishop Butler also speaks. The next week calls it a ward again. 172

June 26: Silas Smith says, "I do know that Bro. Jas C. Snow & E.H. Blackburn stands fair with Pres't B Young for he told me that he had nothing against either of them." <sup>176</sup> July 5: First Presidency writes notes to several bishops in Utah County: <sup>177</sup>

Fall: Goshen Valley settlers abandon Sodom, building two new towns, Mechanicsville near the old fort, and Sandtown a mile southwest of Sodom and 2 miles WNW of the current town [MH] Fall: First settlers at Spring Lake

November 13: "Counsellor Isaac Bullock Presiding," but James C. Snow speaks, so he has clearly been permanently released. 191

November 26: BY writes "Pres. Cyrus H. Wheelock, Springville" 192

January 18: Edward W Clark ordained a bishop by Orson Hyde, Ezra T. Benson, Prest Silas Smith & Bp Jonathan O. Duke. *Is Duke acting Presiding Bishop?*<sup>193</sup>

January 20: Ezra T. Benson reports that he has just visited **Goshen** and disorganized it;<sup>194</sup> "Bishop Phineas Cook of that place was a very good man, but he lacked wisdom," kept telling his members about visions he was having, causing disputations on doctrine. MH says he was only a presiding elder.

Feb 5: "Silas Smith presiding and counselors I Bullock and JO Duke." Duke is frequently presiding over meetings when Smith & Bullock are gone.

Feb 5: John W. Berry (**Spanish Fork**) [KWJH-C65] writes Brigham Young, clearly in a presiding role<sup>196</sup>

15 Feb: William Price ordained bishop of **Goshen** by Brigham Young<sup>197</sup>

Feb 17: Orson Hyde brings William Price to **Goshen**, where he is sustained. 198

February 21: "Spanish Fork, under the presidency of Elder John W. Berry..." 199

March 2: John W. Berry (**Spanish Fork**) writes George A. Smith (Church Historian) with a question about old ward records, clearly in a presiding role.<sup>200</sup>

March 26: BY Writes Spanish Fork Bishop John L. Butler:<sup>201</sup> "Owing to the state of your health, I have thought it best for you to roll the burden of all the business affairs of your ward upon Br. Thurber, your first counselor."

6 April: General bishops meeting includes representatives from the Payson, Lehi, American Fork, Springville, Battle Creek, and Provo Wards.<sup>202</sup>

April 10: Spanish Fork Bishop John L. Butler dies.

April: A.K. Thurber is "Acting Bishop of Spanish Fork Ward." 203

April 18: BY writes "Pres. C.H. Wheelock, **Springville**" *so it is still a dual-leader ward* July 17: Brigham Young notifies Silas Smith that **William Miller** has been ordained the Presiding Bishop for Provo City by Brigham Young on this day. Furthermore, "the time will probably come when it will be well to appoint a President in your place, but we do not deem it best to do so at present; meanwhile, Bro. Miller will act in the capacity of President." *This sure seems to suggest that the presidency of the stake was primarily for Provo city*.

July 22: Jonathan O. Duke (presiding) nominates "Bro. Wm Miller of Springville to be the Presiding Bishop of this place" carried. Miller says he plans to move to Provo. <sup>206</sup>

July 22: **Springville** Elders Quorum reorganized, present are Bishop Aaron Johnson and President C.H. Wheelock<sup>207</sup>

July 24: Annual Celebration is led by "Bishop William Miller (our newly appointed Bishop)." *No mention of a stake president*<sup>208</sup>

July 29: Letter from Brigham Young is read; interpreted by Miller "to take the Presidency of this County." <sup>209</sup> in following months, he is called "President Miller". He doesn't call counselors, so the Provo bishops preside when he is absent.

Fall: In Goshen Valley, Sandtown and Mechanicsville are abandoned for a new town site ("Lower Goshen") 2 miles below Sandtown, 1.5 miles NW of the old fort, 4 miles from present town [MH]

6 Oct: General bishops meeting includes representatives from "Country Wards," including Lehi, Battle Creek, Provo, Spanish Fork, Payson, Pond Town, Springville, and Cedar Valley.<sup>210</sup>

28 Oct: Special meeting at Provo with visiting First Presidency. Attendees include G.A. Smith, Bishop L.E. Harrington (American Fork), Bishop David Evans (Lehi), Bishop Walker (Battle Creek)<sup>211</sup> BY stays at "Bishop Miller's"

December 2: Last entry in 2nd period of *Utah Stake General Minutes*. <sup>212</sup> No more records until mid-1866.

David P. Rainey (Salem Bishop) moves to Cache Valley, replaced as "presiding Elder or Bishop" by Bryan Jolley.[MH]

First school house built in Provo 4<sup>th</sup> Ward, used for all meetings. [MH] First real meetinghouse isn't built until 1881. *What does this say about its ward-ness?* 

# 1861

<u>March 6</u>: Provo Bishop William Miller accuses Springville President Cyrus Wheelock of killing stray cattle.<sup>213</sup>

<u>March 10</u>: At a meeting of the Twelve,<sup>214</sup> Brigham Young sends Orson Hyde and G.A. Smith to "go through the settlements South and settle the difficulties. I want you to settle Cyrus Wheelock's difficulty." *Wheelock is president of Springville Ward* 

March 13-14: Hyde and Smith hold meetings in Springville to investigate allegations of Cyrus Wheelock embezzling cattle.<sup>215</sup> Refers to "their minutes" for details, but when they return from Nephi a few days later, Wheelock calls the meeting to order, so he is apparently still president. March 19: They announce a decision in the Wheelock case (what was it?), Wheelock "called the meeting to order" Wheelock is not mentioned again

6 Apr: General Bishop's meeting, including the bishops of American Fork, Lehi, Pleasant Grove, Payson, Alpine, Springville, Summit Creek, and Provo<sup>217</sup>

May 16: Brigham Young and company "spoke to the people in Springville upon the subject of the dealings of the people with Bishop A. Johnson. He sustained Bishop Johnson in his course." No mention of Cyrus Wheelock. Has he been released as president?

7 Oct: General bishops meeting includes representatives from Pleasant Grove, Provo, American Fork, Cedar Valley, Lehi, Pond Town, Payson, Spanish Fork, Springville, Alpine "Wards." <sup>219</sup>

30 October: Joseph W. Young arrives in **Payson**, having been ordained Bishop and set apart to preside over the ward in Salt Lake City. He then returned to collect his family, whereupon Bishop Franklin W. Young left for Southern Utah. JW Young returned 9 November.<sup>222</sup> 4 Nov: BY writes to "Bishop William Miller, Provo".

Nove 24: "George Sinnett, Pres. of the Elders Quorum Sph. Fork ordained to that office by Pres. Berry" 224

Benjamin F. Johnson presides at Spring Lake Villa [MH], probably part of Payson Adobe schoolhouse completed in 1<sup>st</sup> Ward, its first [MH]

### 1862

9 Feb: Andrew Hunter Scott ordained bishop of "the 2nd Ward Provo City" by John Taylor and George A. Smith<sup>225</sup> James Bird had left for southern Utah [MH]

20 Feb: John B. Fairbanks sustained as Bishop of Payson, as Joseph W. Young has been called to go to the Missouri River to superintend the emigration season.<sup>226</sup> He is ordained by April 27, when he calls his counselors.

18 Feb: BY writes "Bishop L.E. Harrington, American Fork" about a member of "your ward" 6 April: at a general priesthood meeting, 228 "a difficulty between John Barry [Ward president] and Zebedee Coltrin of Spanish Fork was investigated. President Young spoke most of the

Evening and gave instruction upon the different offices of the Priesthood. He told the different duties of the President of the Branch, the Bishop, and the different quorums."

April 7: in one of several talks about bishops and presidents in wards, Orson Hyde says, "I am happy to inform you that I have never heard of any feeling of difficulty between the President and Bishop at Spanish Fork. Brother Young did not know of a single exception to the rule, but I have been informed by all parties that these brethren have never conflicted [President Brigham Young: I wish I had never heard anything to the contrary.]" The dual leadership of Thurber and Berry was one of very few this late.<sup>229</sup>

April 7: General bishops meeting includes bishops of "country wards:" Mountainville, Am'n Fork, Pleasant Grove, Provo, Springville, Span'h Fork, Payson, Goshen, Pond Town<sup>230</sup> 30 May: BY writes "Bishop A.K. Thurber, Spanish Fork" about an issue, mentioning acting Bishop Jolley in **Pondtown** [Salem].<sup>231</sup>

Summer: H. Bryan M. Jolley (Salem bishop/PE) leaves for Southern Utah (Middleton), replaced by president Moses Curtis, Salem becomes a dependent branch of Payson [MH]

October 6: General Bishops Meeting includes representatives from the Cedar Valley, Alpine City, Lehi, Am'n Fork, Pleas't Grove, Provo City, Springville, Span'h Fork, Pond Town, Payson, and Goshen Wards<sup>232</sup>

November: JW Berry released as ward president; He is called to settle in St. George. (MH) *He founded Berryville, later Glendale near Kanab* 

10 Nov: G.A. Smith calls William E. Nuttall as acting bishop of Provo 3rd Ward, replacing Bishop Edward Clark who has resigned.<sup>233</sup> *Clark has moved to Spring Lake near Payson*. MH says Nuttall was ordained at this time

29 Dec: BY's office writes to F.W. Young, discusses earlier time when he was "Bishop of Payson" 234

Small adobe school house built in 2<sup>nd</sup> Ward, its first. What does this say about its wardness?

2 Jan: BY writes "Bishop McBride, Santaguin Ward" 235

Spring: 1st Ward Bishop Duke resigns; his counselors take temporary charge of the ward [MH]

June 8: BY writes to "Bro. Harrington, Bishop at American Fork." 240

July 10: Conference, Brigham Young and members of the Twelve present (DN 13:369)

Sep 2: Church leaders passing through Payson stay with "Bishop John B. Fairbanks" [KWNC-RK2]

October: George A. Smith appoints John P.R. Johnson as bishop of Provo 1<sup>st</sup> Ward [MH] *conflicts with ordination 1866.* 

Oct 25: GA Smith replaces Wm E Nuttall as bishop of Provo 3rd Ward with Myron Tanner<sup>242</sup> *Nuttall is moving to Provo Valley [Heber]* 

Dec 24: A. Milton Musser diarizes, "The Pres't last evening directed me to blend the Santaquin Ward into Payson & install Bro. David Halliday as President over the Branch." <sup>243</sup> Musser is a traveling bishop who does various ecclesiastical and tithing jobs for Brigham Young.

John F. Shields presides over Salem under the Payson bishopric. (MH)

### 1865

Jan 3: BY writes A. Milton Musser, "As Bishop Wm McBride has resigned his bishoprick at **Santa Quin** and desires to be released from his duties, I think it best that that settlement and **Spring Lake Villa** should be attached to the bishoprick of Payson, where Bro. John B.

Fairbanks is presiding as Bishop. You can appoint Elder David Halliday to preside over Santa Quin."<sup>244</sup>

Jan 8: A. Milton Musser meets with the saints at "Gardnersville" with Bishop Price [Goshen]. <sup>245</sup> "This small branch of the church geographically belongs to the Goshen Ward proper but for years has kept aloof" due to a dispute that they tried to resolve. "Heretofore their T[ithing] matters were settled by Bp. Wm McBride [Santaquin] while the distance from Santaquin is about 7 miles. The distance to Goshen is but 3 miles. We told them we were not directly commissioned to bring about this blending…" *Gardnersville was a little NW of current Goshen* Jan 8: A. Milton Musser meets with Santaquin. <sup>246</sup> "By the authority of Prest B Young we placed David Holladay President over this ward. [Vice?] Bishop Wm McBride resigned & attached the ward with its adjuncts to that of Payson under the guidance & direction of Bp. Jno. B. Fairbanks who with his counselors was present. The action & voting were unanimous." *So Santaquin appears to become a dependent ward, not a branch.* 

Jan 8: "The jurisdiction of the bishop of this [**Payson**] ward has this day been extended as far south as Pungen Springs in Juab County and is made to include Santaquin in the south end of this County. Payson Ward now included Salem (Pond Town), Payson, Spring Lake Villa, Santaguin, and Pungen Springs. David H. Holladay was the local president of that [Santaquin] branch of this ward."<sup>247</sup>

Jan 24 [this letter is out of order; is the date correct?]: BY sends A. Milton Musser to consolidate several wards, including "blending" **Alpine** into **American Fork Ward** (Bishop L.E. Harrington), and **Cedar Fort** and **Fairfield** into **Lehi** Ward (Bishop David Evans).<sup>248</sup> They will continue as a branch with a president.

Jan 27: A. Milton Musser reports, <sup>249</sup> "We also blended Alpine Ward with American Fork & Cedar Fort & Fairfield we blended with Lehi." *This would likely have been done on the 26th* Feb 3: BY writes bishops Allen Weeks of **Cedar Valley** and William Miller of **Provo** about members in "your ward." Also to "Elder David M. Holladay," Santaquin, about members "from your place."

April 17: BY writes Charles B. Hancock (Payson), who apparently wants to be bishop again, but BY says the current bishop [Fairbanks] is doing a good job, so there is no opening.<sup>253</sup>

June 8: While Spanish Fork Bishop Albert Thurber is on a mission, Springville Bishop A. Johnson is to act as bishop, George W. Wilkins called as President (MH)

July 24: Pioneer Day celebration at **Alpine** features "Bishop Thomas J. McCullough" *This is despite the January "blending," suggesting that he is continuing under the presiding bishopric of Leonard Harrington.* 

Oct 27: BY writes "Elder George Wilkin, Spanish Fork" to deal with a member "of your place." *This corroborates that Wilkin is acting as ward president, but not a bishop* In rolls sent to the general HPQ president John Young, <sup>256</sup> include HP quorums in Provo,

Payson, American Fork, Springville, Spanish Fork,

November: Teachers quorum reorganized at **Payson** by Bishop Fairbanks, begins to keep a record book. Mentions President Merlin Plum (with counselors) of Pond Town [**Salem**] Branch.<sup>257</sup>

# 1866

Feb 13: Springville Teachers Quorum, assigning teachers to preach in the 4 wards (prayer meetings?). These are clearly not modern wards, or even semi-wards, just districts. It also had 4 wards as early as 1861

Feb 20: BY writes Bishop William Miller about a member.<sup>259</sup> It is very common at this time for BY to write Miller about any and all Provo matters, alongside bishops for neighboring settlements, suggesting that a) the individual ward bishops are of a lower status than a regular bishop, and b) Miller's presiding status is primarily focused on the city, with limited authority over other settlements in the county/stake.

April 5: General bishops meeting resumes after a few years hiatus.<sup>260</sup> Ward reps include bishops of Pleasant Grove, Provo, Payson.

April-May: reports to PB Edward Hunter from Bishop David Evans of Lehi, Bishop L.E. Harrington of American Fork, Bishop John Brown of Pleasant Grove, A.F. Macdonald clerk of "Provo City Ward" (mentioning "Bishop Miller"), Bishop Aaron Johnson of Springville and Spanish Fork Wards, Bishop John B. Fairbanks of Payson Ward, Bishop William Price of Goshen Ward.<sup>261</sup>

1866-06-03: Beginning of 3rd period of Utah Stake General Minutes; weekly citywide Sunday meetings presided over by Bishop Wm. Miller meeting in Bowery. (Short History p.8) 1866-07-22: Provo [Valley?] bishop W.W. Cluff (visiting?) (Short History p.7)

1866-08-19: G.A. Smith ordains J.P.R. Johnson as bishop of 1st Ward (replacing J.O. Duke) with counsellors, Myron Tanner as bishop of 3rd Ward with a counsellor, and a counsellor to Bishop A.H. Scott [of Provo 2nd] (*Short HIstory* p.12)<sup>263</sup>

1866-09-16: Isaac Bullock (returning from mission) reinstated as counselor to Bishop Wm Miller (*Short HIstory* p.13)

November: Spanish Fork Bishop Albert Thurber returns from his mission and resumes his duties Bishop A.H. Scott of Provo 2<sup>nd</sup> Ward leads a wagon train back to the Missouri River for a company of emigrants, his counselors act in his stead [MH]

January 13: AK Thurber is bishop of Spanish Fork<sup>264</sup> George W. Wilkins speaks at this meeting, with no apparent sign of leadership.

January 18: High Council mtg, G.A. Smith presiding (Short HIstory p.23)

23-25 April: Brigham Young and company (on their way to St. George) hold meetings in American Fork (Bishop Harrington), Provo (Bishop Miller), Springville, Spanish fork, Payson, and Santaquin (Bishop Hollady)<sup>265</sup>

May 16: Pleasant Grove Bishop John Brown leaves on a mission to the Southern States. <sup>266</sup> *Thomas Woolley apparently acts in his stead* 

June 21: BY writes to "Bishop A.K. Thurber, **Spanish Fork**" So he is back in charge at this point

July 30: BY writes to "Bishop Tho's J. McCullough, Alpine City," mentioning "your place" 168 Is it an independent ward again?

1867-08-24: Two days meeting with Brigham Young and company. <sup>269</sup> Provo meetinghouse dedicated by John Taylor. Afternoon meeting in bowery: Geo. Q. Cannon presents for sustaining "Wm. Miller as Bishop, Isaac Bullock and Geo W. Bean councillors as the presidency of this Stake of Zion" [bishop and SP?] as well as high council. <sup>270</sup> (*Short History* p.41) *Afterwards, he is generally referred to as Bishop, not President* 

25-27 August: Young and company hold meetings in Payson, Goshen (Bishop Price), and Lehi<sup>271</sup> Young decides to "locate Ghoshen on the east side of the Lake." [Goshen Reservoir?] 1867-09-01: first Sunday in Provo meeting house, **Bishop** Wm. Miller presiding (*Short History* p.43)

1867-10-06: small meetings, encouraged most saints to go to SLC to conference in the new tabernacle (*Short History* p.48)

Oct 12: A list of wards includes Lehi, American Fork, Pleasant Grove, Provo (one entry), Springville, Payson, Goshen. Does not mention Alpine, Cedar Valley, Pondtown, Santaquin, or separate Provo wards.<sup>272</sup>

Oct 18: BY writes Franklin D. Richards, "I have just returned from a visit to **Goshen**, whither I have been for the purpose of locating a new site for their city. A place was selected at the head of their farming lands, east and south of Gardnersville, a small village lying to the south of Goshen Proper. The people were well suited with the choice and will remove there as soon as

1867-12-01: Bp. Wm. Miller calls Wm. A. Follett as bishop of 4th Ward with counsellors <sup>275</sup> Provo Elders Quorum organized with Christoffer Jensen Kempe as president. <sup>276</sup>

# 1868

Feb 9: H.C. Kimball, B. Young, W. Woodruff, J.F. Smith intend to live in Provo part-time. Calls Abraham O. Smoot as "Bishop of Provo City and Pres. of the High Council", Wm. Miller and E.F. Sheets counselors. Also a high council is sustained 277 Again, Presiding Bishop and Stake President? As with Miller, he is called Bishop, not President

Feb 9: "A.O. Smoot was elected bishop of that stake & Wm Miller & EF Sheets wer appntd his councellors." <sup>278</sup>

March 1: "Bro. Moses Curtis" reports to Payson Teacher's Quorum that the people of Pond Town were "dissatisfied with their president, Br. Shields." *Still a dependent branch...* 

March 8: Elders Quorum organized in Salem City. 280

March 11: BY writes "Bishop David H. Holladay, Santaquin" about a matter that is clearly official bishop business.<sup>281</sup>

April 12: "Female Relief Society of Pleasant Grove" organized under the direction of "Acting Bishop Thomas Wooley" 282

April 25: In first of a series of published Church directories, the following are listed: 283

There is nothing that seems to do so much good, or strengthens our faith more, than to have our brethren, who stand in authority over us to visit us, and preach the words of life and salvation to us. The Sunday after Bros. Geo. A. Smith and Musser were here, our Bishop David Evans and Br. Karren, of Lehi City, held a two days' meeting with us...Last Sunday, the High Priests held meetings here. Jas. Rodeback is President of the High Priests here, and at Fairfield also." - Geo. W. Thurmond So it is still under Lehi Ward August 4: Last of a series of published Church directories, same as April 25. Cotober 10: "Bishop Fairbanks [Payson] ... thought he would call on Bro. Merlin Plumb to move back to Pond Town (Salem) and teak the lead of matters there."

Jan 23: Salem Teachers Quorum: "Moved that this ward be divided into two wards, and the east side up the road be known as the first ward, and the west side as the second ward, RH Davis be first teacher of the first ward, John H. Shields be first teacher of the second ward." [parts of page missing] *So it is being called a ward, and the two wards are only teachers wards*

17 April: Daniel H. Wells dedicates new meeting house at Springville. 288

1869-08-01: last page of general minutes with "Provo Stake of Zion" header<sup>289</sup>

May 12: Pleasant Grove Bishop John Brown returns from his mission. 290

August 7: Salem, mentions "President [Merlin] Plumb" [KWZT-BNJ] <sup>291</sup> president of ward? branch? Teachers quorum? No mention of a bishop for the next several months, Teachers quorum seems to be collectively taking in many roles of bishop

23 Sep: AM Musser (Church secretary) writes "Bishop John Brown, P. Grove." 292

1869-10-02: Stake Conference (one of few in this record), but no significant sustainings or business mentioned<sup>293</sup>

October 7: In general conference, several bishops and many others are "called to go on short missions to the Eastern States" (probably to do business for the cooperative mercantile program), including Bishops A K Thurber (Spanish Fork), Fairbanks (Payson), and David Evans (Lehi).<sup>294</sup> Counselors will likely be serving as "acting bishops" in their place.

Oct 28: Pleasant Grove Relief Society mentions "Bp. John Brown" 295

Oct 28: Mention of "Mountainville Ward." 296 Is this name being used interchangeably with Alpine?

Nov 15: Bishop David Fairbanks of **Payson**, who is leaving on a mission with other bishops, nominates Daid Lant to act as [ward] president and I.M. Coombs to act as bishop while he is gone.<sup>297</sup>

Dec 29: Bishop Jonathan O. Duke dies [CC]

1870-02-26: Special Conference, attended by B. Young and several apostles. No sustainings or business mentioned<sup>298</sup>

April 15: Bishop J.B. Fairbanks (**Payson**) returns from his mission.<sup>299</sup> *Other bishops probably returned about the same time*.

May 31: BY writes "President A.O. Smoot" 300

August 4 BY writes "Bishop T.J. McCullough, Alpine City" 301

Sep 10: Salem redivided into three wards (1 East of public square, 2 West of public square, 3 west of pond), still President Merlen Plumb<sup>302</sup>

Oct 1: Robert H. Davis sustained as "President of the Cooperative Store" in Salem, but he is hereafter called President Davis, so it may have been more. 303

October 24-25: Brigham Young, several apostles, and Provo High Council meet in Springville to hear a case against Bishop Aaron Johnson (something to do with the organization of the local cooperative).<sup>304</sup> After exonerating him, "Pres. Young said **a bishop could not be tried, only by a high council and the first presidency**."

Nov 12: First mention of "President Robert H. Davis" in Salem<sup>305</sup>

27 Nov: William Bringhurst appointed the new bishop of Springville [MH]

28 Nov: Springville Bishop Aaron Johnson has recently resigned, William Bringhurst is now bishop<sup>306</sup>

Robert H. Davis called as bishop of Salem [Hanks 80]

January 1: Bishop Fairbanks (**Payson**) appointed his 2<sup>nd</sup> counselor B.F. Stewart to preside over a new small town 3 miles north of Payson called "**Benjamin**" in honor of Stewart.<sup>307</sup> April 26: Bishop Fairbanks (**Payson**) leaves on a mission to England, appointing Orrawell Simons to act until a new bishop is called.<sup>308</sup>

May 31: BY and apostles visit Provo for two days meetings. 323 Several patriarchs ordained, including A.O. Smoot

June: Albert Thurber (Spanish Fork Bishop) sent to Grass Valley near Richfield to work with the Indians.<sup>324</sup> Apparently, George W. Wilkins presides in his absence as President, not Acting Bishop.

Thurber (Spanish Fork), JB Fairbanks (Payson), Wm Bringhurst (Springville), Wm Miller (Provo), and L.E. Harrington (American Fork), and "there was a large representation from the settlements of the county," so this is for the entire stake.<sup>331</sup> The United order is announced and the new High Priests quorum president is sustained.
