### **Wasatch County Timeline**

## 1857

Summer: James C. Snow (Provo Stake President) considers settling Provo Valley

15 August: BY writes JC Snow, "in relation to making a settlement in Provo Valley this all, I have to inform you that I deem it altogether unadvisable, not only on account of the adverse feelings of the Indians in relation to that matter, but also on account of present movements and circumstances whose effect on future plans is as yet unknown." [i.e., the approaching army and threat of war]

## 1858

William Wall, and others build ranches in the valley July: James C. Snow surveys farmland in north of later Heber

### 1859

April: **Heber City** settled; appears to be under the direction of Provo.

May: William Meeks arrives to preside

**Midway**: First settlers arrive in 1859 and two settlements are founded called Midway and Mound City (Upper City) on Snake Creek (Midway MH). Mound City was the larger of the two.

(Encyclopedic History: Midway)

**Charleston**: First settlers arrive in area. (Charleston Ward MH)

Fall: William Meeks resigns as leader of heber Winter: John Jordan PE Heber<sup>2</sup>, 17 families

#### 1860

Center first settled [MH]

Spring: William M. Wall called to lead Heber, with counselors

29 August: Brigham Young and party pass through Wall's Ranch near Heber City.<sup>3</sup> "President directed Brother Wall to take charge of the tithing of that place." *Acting bishop??* 

21 Sep: BY writes to "Bishop William Wall, Provo Valley" 4

October 6: Statistical report from "Provo Valley," Bishop William M. Wall: Heber City, 146 members; Center Creek, 22 members; Snake Creek, 17 members

15 Nov: BY writes to "the Brethren in Provo Valley": "Joseph Stacey Murdock has this day been ordained a bishop,.. And been set apart and instructed to act in his office of Bishop in all the settlements above the toll gate in your valley." *No indication that it was called a ward, just the valley.* 

Wm M. Wall, President at Heber<sup>7</sup>

# 1861

July 8: BY writes "Br. William M. Wall, Heber City, Provo Valley," content suggests a possible presidential role, but not clearly.<sup>8</sup>

August 19: "A Branch of the High Priests quorum" organized by John Young, the president of the Church-wide high priests quorum. Pres. Elisha Everett. Wm Wall and John M. Murdock perform the ordinations. Heber is called a branch.

John Harvey appointed to preside over Center Creek (branch??) [MH] **Lower Snake Creek branch** established. Dependent branch of Heber. President David Van Wagoner<sup>10</sup>

Mound City branch established.

## 1862

April 7: General bishops meeting includes bishops of "Heber City" and "Provo Valley" wards<sup>11</sup> Separate or accidentally duplicated in the list? In several subsequent meetings, a representative of Provo Valley Ward is present.

26 June: Sidney H. Epperson as presiding elder and counselors set over **Mound City**. <sup>12</sup> September: **Round Valley** [Wallsburg] temporarily settled

## 1863

Charleston branch established. Dependent branch of Heber. [MH] July 4 celebration mentions "President William M. Wall" and "Bishop Murdock" 14

### 1864

Fall: Wallsburg established and named, PE Enock Gurr. [EH]

August 20: Brigham Young and company visit Provo Valley and Heber City (aka Heberville). 15 Meeting attendees include "President Wm. M. Wall, Bishop Joseph S. Murdock." Wall "asked to be relieved from his duties as President of that district," which is sustained. BY states that Bishop Murdock "will preside for the present." According to Wilford Woodruff, 16 "Brother Wall...asked for the privilege to resign his office as President of the Stake."

David Van Wagoner PE Lower Snake Creek Settlement. 17 Under direction of Heber bishop. Previously had just been a teachers district of the upper (Mound City) settlement [MH] David Walker PE Charleston?

## 1865

Jan 27: A. Milton Musser (traveling bishop) leaves SLC "with Bros. Jno W. Young [his frequent companion], Wm. W. Cluff [new presiding bishop], & Willard G. Smith [Morgan Bishop] for a visit to Wasatch, Summit, & Morgan Counties...Bro. Cluff, by the President's appointment, is set apart to act as Bishop over the Cos of Wasatch, Summit, & Morgan & now he is on his way to be initiated. These 3 Cos will be represented by 3 wards bearing the names of the Co's & all the business will be done in the name of Bp. Wm Cluff." 18

Feb 2: A. Milton Musser meets in Heber City, 19 "spoke & introduced Wm. Cluff, appointment was ratified." Then he holds meeting at "Upper and Lower settlements of Snake Creek" June 15: BY writes to "Bishop Joseph Murdock, Provo Valley" about a member in "your Ward." 20

August 12: BY writes to "Bishops W.W. Cluff and J.S. Murdock, Heber City" August 23: A. Milton Musser "visited Snake Creek Settlement, called Mound City, Midway & Centre Creek" 22

Fall: WW Cluff appoints Andrew Ross PE **Center**George Noakes PE **Charleston [MH]**, under Heber bishop; replacing David Walker??
Edward Stock PE **Wallsburg**, replacing Enock Gurr [EH]

# 1866

April 5: General bishops meeting resumes after a few years hiatus.<sup>23</sup> Ward reps include bishop of "Wasatch."

May 2: First Presidency writes to "the Bishops and Saints in Wasatch and Summit Counties" with wartime procedures, including settlement abandonment.<sup>24</sup> *No general leader is mentioned* May 7: Report from J.S. Murdock at Heber to Bishop Edward Hunter about available supplies for pioneer company relief.<sup>25</sup>

Charleston, Center Creek, Wallsburg, Lower Settlement, Mound City abandoned during Black Hawk War

May: Upper and Lower Settlements join together at a fort and call it **Midway**. Presiding elder Sidney H. Epperson of Mound City continues to lead in Midway. <sup>26</sup> [dependent branch] [**Date**]: **Lower Snake Creek branch** discontinued. (Website)

[Date]: Mound City branch becomes the Midway branch. Dependent branch of Heber. (Website)

# 1867

Charleston, Wallsburg resettled

**Charleston** PE John Watkins succeeds George Noakes

January or July 26: Bishop Josiah Murdock called to the south, Abram Hatch called by WW Cluff to be Bishop of **Heber City** and PB over all of Provo Valley (under Cluff)

10 Mar: **Midway** HP Quorum organized, divided from Heberville quorum, Pres. Samuel Thompson<sup>27</sup>. Permission was given by Pres. John Young of Salt Lake

May: Wallsburg PE William M. Wall replaces Edward Stock [EH]

Sep 8: "Sunday W.W. Cluff here presiding. He was put to preside over Wasatch, Summit, morgan Stakes" 28

Oct 12: A list of "Wards" includes one entry for "Wasatch Co." 29

Nov 26: A. Milton Musser (traveling bishop) writes to BY from Manti, "Bp Abram Hatch was to visit Wasatch Co. Saturday & Sunday last & no doubt did so, Bp Cluff would meet him there." December 2: Abraham Hatch ordained a bishop by Brigham Young (in Salt Lake City)<sup>31</sup>

December 12/28: Abram Hatch arrives in the valley

Dec 28: Bishop Abraham Hatch welcomed by Heber high priests quorum.<sup>32</sup>

December 29: Abraham Hatch was presented to the Saints in a meeting at Midway by Bishop William W. Cluff and unanimously sustained as Presiding Bishop of Wasatch County in place of Josiah Murdock.<sup>33</sup>

## 1868

March 11: **Midway**: Bishop Abraham Hatch reappointed President Epperson as the Presiding Elder for the settlement. (MH)

April 25: In first of a series of published Church directories, the following are listed:34

- William W. Cluff is listed as presiding bishop of Morgan and Summit Counties, but not mentioned for Wasatch
- Wasatch County: Abram Hatch [Presiding Bishop?]
- Heberville: Abram Hatch

14 November: "Sidney Epherson is PE Midway and are under the bishop in Heber, though at least one member feels neglected by him." <sup>35</sup>

## 1869

January: Wasatch County was taken out of Bishop Cluff's district. (Jesse Haven journal)

July 29: BY writes "Elder Abram Hatch, Bishop Provo Valley, Heber City" about a matter in Midway. 36

September 18: **Wallsburg**: William M. Wall dies at Provo. John C. Parcell succeeds him as Presiding Elder Pro-tem. (MH, CC, EH)

### 1870

January 26: Bishop Abram Hatch of Heber City reports on "his diocese" 37

**Wallsburg**: William E. Nuttall, who had acted as Bishop of the Provo 3rd Ward, arrived and presided in Wallsburg. (EH, MH)

April 10: **Midway**: President Epperson replaced by Henry Samuel Alexander as Presiding Elder in the settlement. (MH)

Dec 20: Relief Society of "Charleston Ward of Wasatch Stake of Zion" organized under the direction of Bishop John Watkins.<sup>38</sup> *This is a later recollection (1900?) so the terms can't be trusted* 

# 1871

2 March: Same member complains to general authorities about Midway being neglected and them needing their own bishop.<sup>39</sup>

Heber East Ward Record starts with members "received into the Branch" Feb 1871<sup>40</sup> March 19: first minutes for "Heber Branch of the Church in Wasatch county"<sup>41</sup> This and subsequent meetings led by Thomas H. Giles (Hatch's counselor) and T Hicken; Bishop Abram Hatch is present, sometimes conducting, consistently and repeatedly called a branch. By November 1871, Bishop Hatch is consistently noted as presiding at meetings, unless he is not there, then Giles is presiding.

July 7: "Bishop Wm Cluff from Coalville" is attending 2-day meeting at Heber, but Bishop Abram Hatch is still presiding<sup>44</sup>

July 26: BY writes "Prest. A.O. Smoot" in Provo about a matter from Provo Valley [Heber] that has been appealed to the "High Council of Provo," confirming that they should deal with it.<sup>45</sup> July 31: Bishop Abram Hatch reports on "his diocese."

# 1873

March 19: List of bishops: WASATCH COUNTY. ABRAHAM HATCH, Presiding Bishop. \*Heber City, Abraham Hatch; Midway, Henry S. Alexander; Charleston, John Watkins; Wallsburgh, Wm. E. Nuttall. 47

May 14: List of Presiding Elders and Bishops, same as March: 48

May 18: In Heber minutes, first reference to itself as "Heber Ward." (but just one, "Branch" still persists after that, next mention of "Ward" Oct 12) Bishop Hatch still presiding

Dec 14: "A conference of the whole Wasatch Ward assembled at the new meeting house in Heber City, A. Hatch Bp. presiding" <sup>50</sup>

December 12: Conference of "Wasatch Ward" 51

Center resettled [MH], same president??

May 27: List of Presiding Elders and Bishops, same as May 1873:52

July 7: United Order organized

3 August: Finished building a new schoolhouse in Heber City. 53

August 28: report of a conversation with Abram Hatch of "Provo Valley," Wasatch County, mentions "the Bishop's diocese." <sup>54</sup>

Sep 14: Heber City, person was "cut off from this branch of the church" 55

Oct 21: List of Presiding Elders and Bishops, same as May. 56

Nov 1: Heber still calls itself a branch, Bishop Hatch and counselors still directly presiding<sup>57</sup> This continues through 1875-1876

Daniel settled as an outgrowth of Center Ward

# 1875

Jan 6: List of Presiding Elders and Bishops, same as October 1874.<sup>58</sup>

June 9: List of Bishops and Presiding Elders, same as January. 59

August 27, 28: Two days meeting in Heber City, presided by John Taylor, W Woodruff, GQ Cannon and E.F. Sheets. Main topics include Reformation (Bishop Hatch and other leaders rebaptized) and the United Order. <sup>60</sup> Bishops WW Cluff and Samuel Atwood from Summit County are present and speak, but apparently not in any supervisory capacity.

Dec 29: New list of Presiding Elders and Bishops, same as June. 61

January 12: List of Bishops and Presiding Elders, same as December 1875.<sup>62</sup>
April 2: First record of "Wallsburgh Branch", Prest. William E. Nuttall<sup>63</sup>
December 22: Final published list of Bishops and Presiding Elders (no change since 1873).<sup>64</sup>

Dear Brother

...Dear Brother I can tell you A nother great truth that there is nether A man nor woman nor child but would gladly hail A Bishop of our own the building up of our settlement is greatly [page 5] detartded by not haveing one but I will not say any more about these matters A hint to the wise is anough but can answer any question you may ask

Dear brother I have only given you A very few hints just one more item that happened hear on Sunday, as our Bishop happened to come over to preach to us which happens about once in 5 or 6 weeks. In his usual way of teaching and exhorting his brethen and sisters it was A dig heare A dig there A slur here and A slur there, he was very much dissapointed at so few being to meeting but he had heard it was because he was here but if they did not like to come to meeting because he was here, he could not help it. [page 9] when I was took sick I missed meeting four sundays and two sundays because I had no hat and then they postponed all meetings untill our Chool house was fixt as it was not fit to meet in and it was there I took my first cold and when they commenced haveing meetings again I was still unablt to attand... then our Bishop and president branded me for the first time in my life as an apastate because I mist meeting a few times this arounsed the spunck a little of Brothe David Van Wagner our presidents first counsler...

Biography of Sydney Epperson by his son:

"At a meeting held June 26, 1862, Sidney H. Epperson was appointed Presiding Elder (the Upper Settlement) with John Fausett, first and Samuel Thompson, second counselors. This was his first calling to labor in the ministry... In 1864 David Van Wagoner was appointed to preside over about twenty families at the lower Settlement. The Upper Settlement had now increased to thirty-six families, making a total of fifty-six families in the two settlements. Joseph S. Murdock was Bishop over the whole valley...

The settlers now saw the need of united action for the preparation and safety of their families. However, the Upper Settlement colonists did not feel like moving to the Lower Settlement and vice versa.

In the spring of 1866, under the energetic direction of their presiding leader, Elder Sidney H. Epperson, a compromise location was chosen half way between the two and the settlers Forted in. The name Fort Sidney was suggested in honor of their leader and met with unanimous approval, but Sidney said, 'No. We'll call it Midway.'

...Sidney H. Epperson presided over Midway from the beginning... The Old Fort was reserved by the town as a public square. The upper and lower settlements were never rebuilt...

George Noakes and Freeman Manning wintered stock in the south end of the valley in 1858 near Decker Ranch. They settled at Charleston the following year with Nymphus C. Murdock, Enoch Gurr and the Daybells, with David Walker first presiding Elder...

Round Valley, now Wallsburg, was settled in the spring of 1864... Enoch Gurr was the first presiding Elder there...

On March 11, 1868, Sidney H. Epperson was reappointed by Abraham Hatch, with David Van Wagoner and Ira N. Jacobs, counselors, to preside at Midway...

On April 10, 1870, Sidney H. Epperson was released as Bishop of the Midway Ward and H.S. Alexander sustained, with David Van Wagoner and John Huber as counselors... After ten years of a faithful and enjoyable service, presiding over a branch of the church, Father had magnified his calling and received a most honorable release."
